FROM THE MANAGER'S DESK

Updates on various projects and Township news from August – November 2020

Due to the pandemic, a revenue loss was recognized in 2020 and is projected for 2021. The Township Board balanced the budget for 2021 with no tax increase by using some of the Township's unassigned fund balance or savings.

YORK TOWNSHIP WINTER MAINTENANCE OVERVIEW

The objective of the York Township Department of Public Works winter maintenance program is to provide safe roads to the traveling public.

WINTER MAINTENANCE

York Township is comprised of approximately 400 miles of Township roads. This year, these roads will be divided into 19 predetermined routes with specific operators and equipment assigned to each. The majority of the time, this is the standard deployment, however, there is a response where only six (6) operators respond to and treat what are designated as the snow emergency routes. Snow emergency routes are posted with signs and have been designated as such due to high traffic volume, steep grades, close proximity to the Schools, Police, Fire and Medical Facilities.

In addition to the normal response of plowing roads after precipitation starts, you may also observe a pre-treatment of liquid brine sprayed on certain roads prior to a predicted event. This pre-treatment is done with only two trucks and only on certain roads (approximately two thirds of the snow routes).

SNOW EMERGENCIES

On rare occasions a snow emergency will be declared. A snow emergency is when the forecast predicts ten or more inches of snowfall. The initial focus will be on the snow emergency roads. All snow emergency roads are identified with signage. The snow emergency declaration will be broadcast on the local radio and television stations and will be posted on the York Township website. In accordance with the ordinance, once a snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful at any time during the continuance of the emergency for any person:

- To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency routes designated; or
- 2. To operate a motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route in such a manner or in such a reasonable condition as to allow or permit such vehicle to become stalled on such route, either by reason of the fact that the driving wheels of such vehicle are not equipped with tire chains or effective tires or by reason of the fact that the motor fuel supply of such vehicle has been allowed to become exhausted.

Please be aware that failure to abide by the above is a violation of a Township ordinance and may result in fines and/or towing costs. For a complete listing of the streets and a full text of the ordinance, please visit the Township website.



STATE ROADS

Many roads within York Township are owned and maintained by the state (PennDOT). PennDOT has their own policies and procedures for winter maintenance. Please contact the local PennDOT maintenance office at 717-848-6230 for information about state road maintenance. York Township does not perform winter maintenance on any state roads.

MAILBOXES

It is the policy of York Township to not compensate for damage to mailboxes, or any other object, caused by snow removal. Mailboxes, fences, shrubbery, etc. placed in the public right-of-way is done at the owner's risk. The public right of way is on average 50 feet wide (25 feet from the center of the roadway). Damage to a mailbox typically occurs when the weight of the snow lands on the box. Prior to winter, make sure your mailbox is sturdy and secure.

STREET CLEANING

Street cleaning typically begins after the completion of winter maintenance. It is a continuous process that does not stop until all Township roads have been cleaned. York Township is not responsible for state roads, therefore does not clean or maintain them.

ZONING

ORDINANCE REVIEW – KEEPING LIVESTOCK AND DOMESTIC PETS

Residents are encouraged to call the Township BEFORE deciding to bring home any type of livestock to determine if their property meets the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance. Noncommercial Keeping of Livestock is permitted in the RA District as an accessory use, and is permitted by special exception in the RL and RM Districts as an accessory use, subject to additional regulations, including, but not limited to: minimum acreage, number of animals per acre, and setbacks for shelters. Domestic pets are allowed in all Districts and, in most cases, are considered those animals which are kept within a dwelling and would be locally available for purchase at a pet store.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

Each year the Township typically receives and follows up on more than 200 concerns from residents relating to property maintenance. The majority of those concerns have to do with high grass, unlicensed/unregistered vehicles, general upkeep of buildings, garbage/rubbish that has accumulated around a property, storage of recreational vehicles, and visibility at intersections. By continuing to maintain their property and keeping trees and shrubs from overgrowing intersections, property owners help the Township save on inspections, mailings and court filings. Thank you to everyone who takes pride in their property and helps to keep the Township and their neighborhood looking great!

INTRODUCING THE YORK COUNTYWIDE ACTION PLAN FOR CLEAN WATERS!

As part of PA DEP's Phase 3 Watershed Implementation Plan (WIP), York County, along with several other counties, has been tasked with the goal to reduce nitrates, a form of pollution, in its streams, creeks, and rivers. Each county has their own numerical goals to reach by the year 2025 and were given the opportunity to tackle this goal from a bottom up approach. For York, The York County Planning Commission, York County Conservation District, and York County Coalition for

Clean Waters worked in partnership and have planned and begun implementing York's Countywide Action Plan (CAP) for Clean Waters.

During the planning process, five action teams were formed: Data Management, Legislative and Programmatic Changes, Education and Outreach, Revenue Building, and Project Implementation. For just about a year, these five action teams, whose participants are volunteers, have been working on implementing the York CAP and have made substantial progress. The Data Management team assisted in the development of a program called FieldDoc that will assist in receiving credit for currently unreported best management water quality practices. The Legislative and Programmatic Changes team worked on a draft watershed permit concept and was at the table of several important legislative and programmatic discussions. The Education and Outreach team offered support when York County Planning Commission applied for a grant that would assist with a long-term messaging strategy for the CAP and York's clean water initiatives. The grant was awarded, and work continues now with a marketing firm. The Education and Outreach team also helped with the design and content creation of a bimonthly newsletter called the Re-CAP, which is readily available in the York Township administration lobby. Revenue Building concentrated on figuring out where funding is already occurring and are trying to match CAP actions with funding sources. It is estimated that the CAP will cost just over 30 million dollars to fully implement, so finding funds to get projects done is quite essential. The Project Implementation team followed the lead on several projects this year and planted hundreds of trees across the County. They also assisted with getting landowners who would like to put a project on their property connected to the right resources.

The York County CAP had a successful first year, especially considering all of the pandemic challenges that were faced. The annual report has been submitted, and of more than 50 actions in the CAP, only three had no progress made this

first year which is remarkable considering this is a volunteer effort! The CAP is currently facing year two, and the coalition is searching for more people to join in its efforts, and for landowners who might be interested in helping York reach its goal while positively impacting the water quality of York County. The hard work is nowhere close to being done. YOUR DIGITAL "GO BAG"


Many people ... perhaps even most of us ... have our smartphones with us practically 24/7. For some, it is our *sole source* of telephone communications. Also texting, Messenger, Facetime, Zoom, and social media apps on the phone comprise a large part of our human interaction. (We do recommend talking to real humans from time to time, to stay in practice.)

Your smartphone can be a great source of <u>preparedness information</u> as well. We are going to tell you about some of our favorite <u>free</u> preparedness phone apps, all of which are available for Android (recent OS versions). There may be similar (or even the same) apps available for IOS devices too.





Emergency Safety Tips




- <u>FEMA App</u> This app provides comprehensive information on preparedness, mitigating risk, disaster resources including information on applying for disaster assistance, and the ability to receive alerts for multiple locations.
- <u>511PA</u> This app provides a wealth of information on travel in the Commonwealth. It contains a Traffic Map with current conditions, still images and streaming video of traffic cameras, travel alerts, winter road conditions and PennDOT snowplow status, and a LOT of other travel related information.
- <u>Weather</u> There are a lot of good weather apps. Pick the one you like best, and be sure to enable NWS Alerts via the app. One that I like is called MyRadar which gives a nice high-resolution radar loop. I also like StormRadar. It's a good practice to have a second app that does *the same thing* in case the first one has a service outage. For multi-purpose functionality, some of the local news stations have interactive weather radar and alerting on their apps (as well as breaking news). WGAL8 and FOX43 both have these apps, and other local channels may also.

National Weather Service also has a web page with comprehensive weather forecasts, weather imaging data, maps, forecast discussion, warnings and advisories, etc. You can create a shortcut on your home screen that runs the NWS page as a mini-app.

- <u>EatSafePA</u> If you keep missing the weekly Dept. of Agriculture report on restaurant inspections listing who is out of compliance, you can use the EatSafePA app, which lets you view a list or a map to retrieve the most recent inspection report for an establishment.
- <u>CDC</u> App has links to current information about diseases like COVID-19, influenza, Lyme disease, etc. They also track outbreaks (e.g., food poisoning incidents), provide travel notices, statistics, podcasts, and online versions of their newsletters. (CDC's Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report [MMWR] is a great source of epidemiological information.)
- <u>Personal Safety</u> Android OS has a personal safety app built into more recent versions. It has tips on staying safe, and allows you to set Emergency sharing, perform Safety checks, list Emergency contacts, etc.
- Red Cross First Aid Well designed app that provides basic first aid information on a comprehensive list of conditions, with numerous helpful graphic images.
 FAQs appear at the end of topics to address specific questions related to the first aid topic being viewed.
- Red Cross Pet First Aid Similar to the First Aid app, but for emergencies that
 may occur with Cats and Dogs. There is also a section to enter information for
 your pet, and preparedness information.

RECYCLING

RESIDENTIAL BRUSH DROP OFF

Brush is defined as tree limbs, shrubbery, leaves and the like (no grass) no larger than 8 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length. York Township accepts brush from York Township residents as part of our recycling efforts. Brush recycling is intended to clean up reasonable quantities of debris from residential properties. The program is not intended to accept debris from commercial entities. If you have large amounts of material to dispose, please contact York Township Public Works Department for approval.

NEW FOR 2021 – The drop-off site will remain open daily, from dawn to dusk throughout the year and will close occasionally to grind up the materials to make mulch. Please refer to the Township website for updates. The site is located at the Township Building beyond the gate between the two signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road, for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

Please participate in this program responsibly by **not** dumping unlawful items at the site. Examples of unlawful items include garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings, etc. Damage to the grinder can and has occurred when items, other than brush, have been dropped off and go through the grinding head. If misuse occurs, the Township may be forced to close the drop-off site unannounced.

All other material and items you see beyond the gate are for Township use only and are not meant for the general public to use or take. If you see a violation, please report it to the Township or York Area Regional Police Department. **The site is under constant video surveillance.**

Public Works will process the brush into mulch that will be made available to Township residents currently free of charge and on a first-come first-served basis. The mulch pile is located in front of the gate (left side). Mulch may **not** be available at all times. Mulch availability and the times and dates of brush recycling are subject to change at Township discretion.

COMMERCIAL RECYCLING IS REQUIRED BY LAW

Pennsylvania State Act 101 of 1988 and York Township Ordinance 2006-12 require nonresidential establishments to recycle. To comply with the State and Local laws, you are required to recycle the following items:

- Aluminum
- High-Grade Office Paper
- Corrugated Paper (cardboard)
- Glass (clear, brown and green)
- Steel and Bimetallic Can
- Leaf Waste

RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Penn Waste has been contracted by the Township for residential trash and recycling services. All residences are required to have trash service. Please contact Penn Waste directly to establish services. Effective January 1, 2021 rates will be increasing by \$0.66 per quarter due to an increase in waste processing costs.

Fee schedule is as follows:

January 1, 2021 - June 30, 2021 = \$52.25 per quarter

The optional 96-gallon mobile trash cart rental fee will be:


July 1, 2020 - June 30, 2021 = \$12.20 per quarter

Each resident is permitted (3) 32-gallon bags or cans of trash, unlimited recycling with cart, one large item per week, 12 items per year curbside yard waste collection. Additional service bags can be purchased at the York Township Finance Office for \$4.50. Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. Carts should be placed a minimum of 3 feet from all other objects and facing the street. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) items shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection, and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight in the evening when collection occurs.

Large (Bulk) Items: Residential customers are entitled to place one large (bulk) item out per week with your regular trash and recycling. You only need to contact Penn Waste in advance if the item contains refrigerant or hazardous waste. Bulk items are those which cannot be disposed in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people (i.e. sofa, mattress, carpet, etc.) Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their rent or condo/homeowners fee must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.

Please place cart at curb with lid opening toward street.

Keep cart three feet from all objects and clear from overhead hazards such as trees and power lines.



RECYCLING

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING

All recyclables must be cleaned and dried before placing them your recycling bin. Any soiled materials should be discarded in your regular trash bin.

CAN BE INCLUDED:

Metal – aluminum beverage cans, steel food and beverage cans, empty aerosol cans, empty paint cans

Glass – clear, brown, and green food and beverage containers

Plastics – bottles and jugs #1, #2, & #5, neck narrower than the sides of the bottle

Newspaper

Cardboard

Cartons – milk, juice, soup, wine, broth, cream, egg substitutes

CANNOT BE INCLUDED:

Soiled Materials – dirty diapers, wet cardboard, food waste, food-soiled materials, used paper towels or tissues **Hazardous Materials & Medical Waste –** all solvent, oil, chemical containers, propane tanks, pool chemicals, batteries, and NEEDLES

Electronic Waste – computers, computer accessories, television, monitors, and e-readers

Packing Materials – Styrofoam, packing peanuts, shredded paper, and bubble wrap

Lights & Glassware – light bulbs, string of lights, drinking glasses, broken glass, and mirrors

Paper & Paperboard – newspaper inserts, magazines, catalogs/brochures, envelopes & junk mail, food boxes pizza boxes, paper towel & toilet paper rolls, office paper (any color), tissue boxes, phones books, and other soft cover books

WASTE OIL DISPOSAL

Used oil (motor, cooking, transmission) may be dropped off at the Public Works Service Building Monday through Friday from 7:30 am – 3:00 pm. You may enter the lower restricted area for this purpose. A Township employee will assist you with the drop of the products. Do not drop off products after hours. We do not accept gasoline or engine coolant (anti-freeze). Please be aware that the site is under constant video surveillance.

RESIDENTIAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents ONLY and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to noon at the Small Load Drop-Off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406.

YARD / WOODY WASTE COLLECTION

Township residents are encouraged to recycle their yard/woody waste by either curbside collection or at the Township drop-off facility. Material such as tree and shrubbery trimmings and other organic landscape vegetation is acceptable provided the limbs are no larger than 8 inches in diameter and no longer than 4 feet long (NOTE: Township brush dimensions are no larger than 8 inches in diameter and no longer than 6 feet long). Grass, weeds, dirt, stones, fruit & vegetable scraps, trash or recyclables are NOT accepted. Yard waste must either be bundled with biodegradable twine (50-pound weight limit). placed in a brown Kraft bag or in a 32-gallon can without a lid. Yard waste placed in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected. Yard waste must be out for collection by 6:00 am on the pickup date and be visible to the hauler. Standard collection dates are the 4th Saturday of the month, March through October. There will be no yard waste pickup in January or February.



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Observed holidays are noted in RED. Collection days that fall on or after the holiday will be delayed one day. EXCEPTION: If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is no change in service prior to or after the holiday.

BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES



- Trash, Recycling, one bulk item and yard waste (see calendar above for scheduled dates) must be curb side by 6:00 AM
 on your scheduled collection day.
- No more than three (3) trash bags or containers will be collected each week.
- · Bags or containers must not exceed 32 gallons or 50 pounds.
- Bulk items that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted.
- Yard Waste must be in biodegradable Kraft Bags or tied in bundles not exceeding 4 feet in length or 50 pounds.
- Call Penn Waste to schedule collection of appliances containing freon (air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.)
- · No construction debris will be collected curb side.

The annual presentation of Scholarship Awards took place at the October 2020 Board of Commissioners' monthly meeting. Commissioner Jones thanked Barry Myers for coordinating the scholarship awards.

NEW SOUTHERN AREA FIRE AND EMERGENCY RESCUE ORGANIZED

New Organization Formed to Improve Community Public Safety Services

Dallastown, PA – Representatives from two volunteer fire-rescue companies that serve Dallastown and Yoe Boroughs and parts of York and Windsor Townships in York County jointly announced today that they are starting a new chapter in their history. The new *Southern Area Fire and Emergency Rescue*, also known as *SAFER York*, was formed to improve public safety services and create a stronger volunteer fire-rescue service to serve these municipalities and surrounding communities.

"When this group of dedicated public servants looked at all the options available to improve the volunteer fire-rescue service from the community's perspective, it was decided that a merger of Rescue Fire Company No. 1 Dallastown and Yoe Fire Company was the best path forward for the residents, businesses, and visitors to the area," Ron Miller, Chairman of the merger steering committee said.

Barry Myers, a life member and President of the Yoe Fire Company, agreed that there were several reasons to complete the merger. "We see how many volunteer Fire-Rescue and EMS organizations are struggling today across Pennsylvania and the country trying to maintain manpower, be fiscally responsible and provide top-notch service. Instead of waiting until both organizations were struggling, the merger allows us to begin the next chapter in the history of these two fire companies stronger than ever before," he stated. - ADVANCE PAYMENT is required for all programs as it will ensure a space in the class/program. Checks may be made payable to York Township.
- PARTICIPATION in any class/program/event constitutes permission to use likeness in promotional materials.
- THE DEPARTMENT is NOT responsible for injuries while participating in any of its activities.
- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician will be required. No refunds for Bus Trips will be given when spots are cancelled less than 30 days before trip unless the trip is cancelled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- PROGRAM SIZE is limited and will be filled on a first-come, first-serve basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.
- PROGRAM DATES & TIMES are contingent on availability of facilities and are subject to change.
- **PROGRAMS** postponed or not held by the instructor due to emergencies will be made up by the instructor or fees will be prorated. Classes missed by the participant will not be made up.

PARK RULES/HOURS

- All Township Parks, with the exception of York Township Park, are closed between dusk to dawn. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
- No littering.
- No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
- NO GOLFING IN PARKS. Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
- Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned. Grills may not be placed on picnic tables.
- · No solicitation.
- No alcoholic beverages or drugs. No one shall use or be under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs in any parks.
- . Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, riffles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.
- Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
- Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
- No facilities may be reserved or events scheduled without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
- Parks may be closed if hazardous conditions endanger life or property. In said event, there should be no trespassing on park property in said times.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
- Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
- No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game trucks etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.
