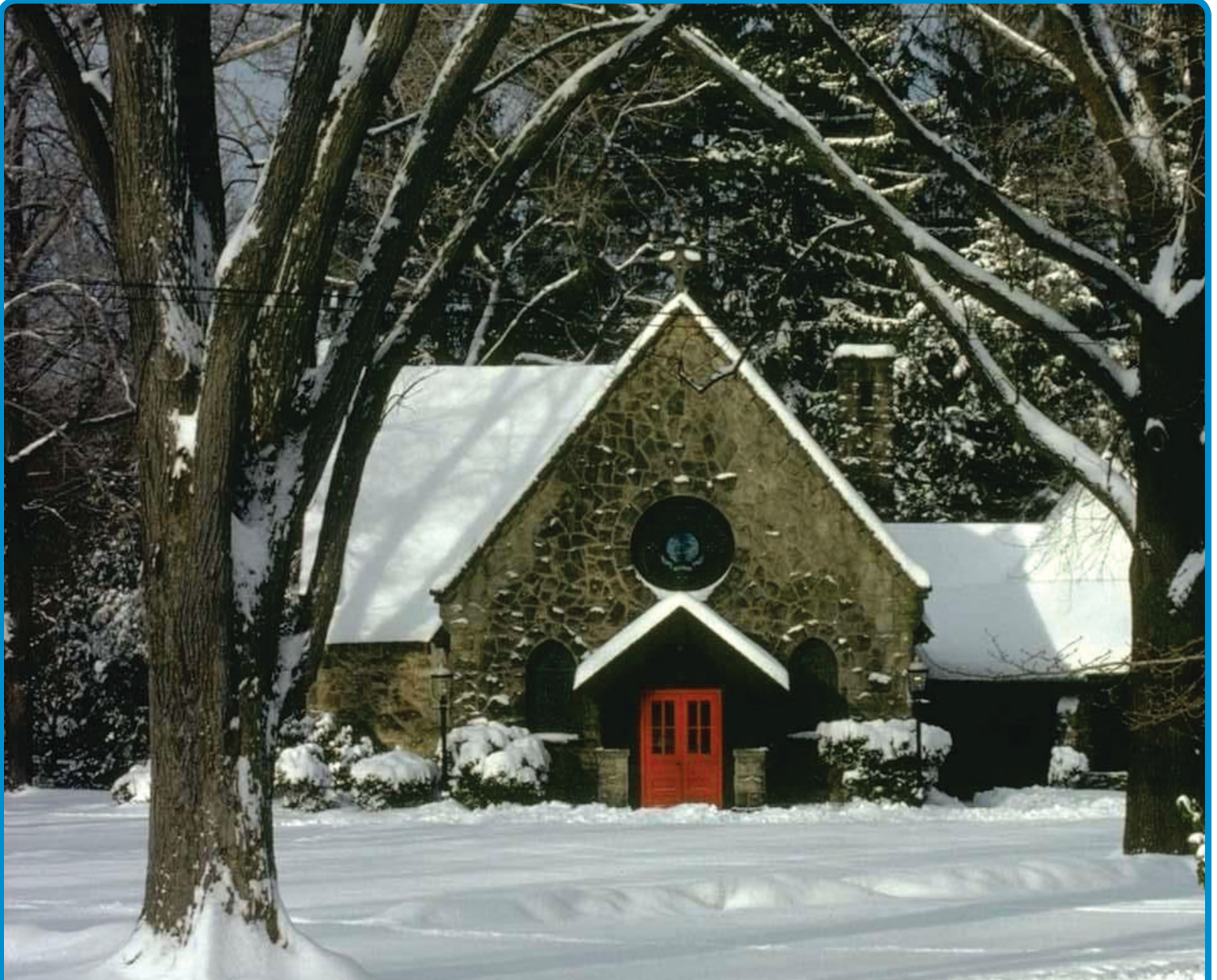

From the Manager's Desk

Updates on various projects and Township news from July-October 2017

COMMISSION NEWS

- The Oak Road box culvert was replaced by the Public Works Department.
- The York Township Water and Sewer Authority purchased a property adjacent to the Green Valley Road Pumping Station for a future upgrade.
- The Township received notification that we are to receive \$182,000 on our #3 Green Light Go Grant for improvements at the intersection of South Queen Street and Springwood Road.
- The Township received a grant from the York County Community Foundation for \$10,000 to be used towards the Queenswood stream improvement project.
- Zoning amendment was approved to change the zoning from residential medium density to commercial office for 1873 Powder Mill Road.
- The Board approved joining the York County Stormwater Consortium cooperation agreement to implement the Regional Chesapeake Bay Pollution Reduction Plan.
- A Memorandum of Agreement between York Township EMA and Dallastown EMA to collaborate and share services was approved.
- The Board approved the inter-municipal transfer of liquor licenses into York Township to be used at the Rutter's at 129 Leader Heights Road and at the Weis Markets at 693 Lombard Street.
- The Board approved, with conditions, the final land development plan for Member's 1st located at 2124 South Queen Street.
- The Board approved, with conditions, the final land development plan for DJ Plaza expansion located at 2058 South Queen Street.
- The Board adopted the streets of the Fountainhead development and a portion of the Springwood at Mill Creek development.

TOWNSHIP EXPENSES TO RISE SIGNIFICANTLY DUE TO PADEP/ EPA STORMWATER MANDATES AND PUBLIC SAFETY

York Township is located in the Chesapeake Bay watershed. Due to this, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Penna. Department of Environmental Protection (PaDEP) are mandating that steps be taken to make improvements to stormwater that runs from private and public properties to our creeks and streams so that less sediment, nitrates, and phosphorus goes into them and eventually into the Chesapeake Bay. In order to meet these new requirements, the Township joined the York County Stormwater Consortium (Consortium) where any project completed in one of the participating municipalities is applied to all of the municipalities in the consortium. The cost to participate in the Consortium since 2015 was \$11,748 per year. A new DEP permit cycle begins in 2018. The new cycle has more stringent requirements along with the pollution reduction requirements. Beginning in 2018, the cost to the Township will increase by \$206,237 to \$217,985 for each of the next five years to participate with the Consortium. The Township did an assessment and determined it was significantly cheaper to participate in the Consortium versus going alone. Additional new permit requirements will be undertaken by existing Township staff.

The cost to provide public safety (police, fire and ambulance) has steadily increased. The costs per year from 2015 to 2017 were, respectively: \$5,112,211, \$5,209,962 and \$5,314,970. The 2018 costs will increase by \$124,072 to \$5,436,456 for a total three year increase of \$324,245 or 6%. Up to this point, the Township has been able to cover these increased expenses.

To help cover these required additional expenses due to stormwater mandates and required public safety, the Board approved a .16 mil increase for a general millage real estate tax increase and .04 mil increase in the fire tax for 2018. This equates to an additional \$20.00 per year for a residential property that is assessed at \$100,000, \$30.00 per year for a residential property assessed at \$150,000 and \$40.00 per year for a residential property assessed at \$200,000.

I wish you a happy 2018! Hopefully we don't have a terrible winter this year.

Please contact the office by e-mail or phone if you have not received your 2018 County/Township Tax bill by the end of February 2018. If you plan on being away the beginning of February, or you have moved and still own the property, please contact the office by phone or e-mail for instructions on where you would like us to send your tax bill. If your spouse has passed away and you wish to take their name off the tax bill only, you will need to bring a copy of the death certificate and fill out the paperwork for the York County Assessment Office. The office will have the Property Tax Rebate forms and School Rebate forms the beginning of March. If you are over 65, or over 50 and are a widow/widower or you are disabled, you may qualify for the Property Tax Rebates from the State and School. Feel free to call me and I will help you determine if you qualify.

If you have delinquent taxes from prior years, you will need to contact the York County Tax Claim Bureau for payment information. The York County Tax Claim Bureau's phone number is **717-771-9205**.

PERMITS & ZONING

ORDINANCE REVIEW – KEEPING OF LIVESTOCK AND DOMESTIC PETS

Residents are encouraged to call the Township BEFORE deciding to bring home any type of livestock to determine if their property meets the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance. Noncommercial Keeping of Livestock is permitted in the RA District as an accessory use, and is permitted by special exception in the RL and RM Districts as an accessory use, subject to additional regulations, including, but not limited to: *minimum acreage, number of animals per acre, and setbacks for shelters.*

Domestic pets are allowed in all Districts and, in most cases, are considered those animals which are kept within a dwelling and would be locally available for purchase at a pet store.



PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

Each year the Township typically receives and follows up on more than 200 concerns from residents relating to property maintenance. The majority of those concerns have to do with high grass, unlicensed/unregistered vehicles, general upkeep of buildings, garbage/rubbish that has accumulated around a property, storage of recreational vehicles, and visibility at intersections. By continuing to maintain their property and keeping trees and shrubs from overgrowing intersections, property owners help the Township save on inspections, mailings and court filings. YORK TOWNSHIP WINTER MAINTENANCE POLICIES

OVERVIEW

The objective of the York Township Department of Public Works winter maintenance program is to provide safe roads to the traveling public.

WINTER MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

We divided all Township roads into 18 sections or routes. An operator, with pre-determined equipment, is assigned to one of these 18 routes. The majority of the time this is the standard deployment, however depending on the conditions we may only deploy 6 operators to treat the snow emergency roads or what is designated as the priority routes. Snow emergency roads are posted with signs and are designated as such due to factors of high traffic volume, steep grades, or close proximity to the Schools, Police, Fire and Medical Facilities.

Prior to the storm you may notice the pre-treating of certain priority roads with liquid brine. The brine is a specific concentration (23.3%) of sodium chloride that lowers the freezing point of water. Although we would like to pre-treat all of our roads, it's just not possible due to the time it takes. New this season is the addition of a third pre-treat vehicle. When appropriate we plan to pre-treat all of the snow emergency routes with liquid brine.

SNOW EMERGENCIES

On rare occasions a snow emergency will be declared. The initial focus will be on the priority roads. The snow emergency declaration will be broadcast on the local radio and television stations and will be posted on the York Township website. Again, all snow emergency streets are identified with signage. After the snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful at any time during the continuance of the emergency for any person:

1. To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency routes designated; or
2. To operate a motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route in such a manner or in such a reasonable condition as to allow or permit such vehicle to become stalled on such route, either by reason of the fact that the driving wheels of such vehicle are not equipped with tire chains or effective tires, or by reason of the fact that the motor fuel supply of such vehicle has been allowed to become exhausted.

Please be aware that failure to abide by the above is a violation of a Township ordinance and may result in fines and / or towing costs. For a complete listing of the streets and a full text of the ordinance please visit the Township web site.

STATE ROADS

Many roads within York Township are maintained by PennDOT. These roads include: Interstate 83, South Queen, Leader Heights, South George, Tyler Run, Old Baltimore Pike, Grantley, Springwood, Camp Betty Washington, Reynolds Mill, Cape Horn, Iron Stone Hill, Winterstown, Days Mill, Hollywood, Brillhart Station, South Duke, South Franklin, Horn, Hess Farm (a portion), Country Club, Lombard, South Pleasant, Indian Rock Dam, and East Prospect. PennDOT uses their policies and procedures for winter maintenance. Please contact the local PennDOT maintenance office at 717-848-6230 for assistance.

MAILBOXES AND DRIVEWAYS

York Township will not compensate property owners should their mailbox, or any other object become damaged due to the removal of snow from Township roads. Any object placed in the road right-of-way, including a mailbox, fence, landscaping, etc. is placed there at the owner's risk. The public right of way is on average 50 feet wide (25 feet from the center of the roadway).

It is suggested that you wait until after all plowing is complete before shoveling out the end of your driveway. If you do shovel out before the plows have come through try to clear a spot upstream of your driveway. This will allow the snow from the plow to unload before the driveway. It won't prevent all snow from going back in front of your driveway, but it will reduce the amount. The snow must be plowed from the street, therefore all driveways and properties will be affected to some degree.

CONCLUSION

New roads added to our list of more than 120 lane miles of roads are the final phase of Burrows Road and Country Ridge Drive. It takes time to get to all these roads safely. The 80 plus cul-de-sacs and several hundred intersections makes it even more time consuming. Please be patient. Each and every storm is different, however the only constant is our response. You can find links to plow routes and maps by visiting the public works area on the York Township website throughout the Township.

Just a friendly reminder to the property owners in York Township. It is your responsibility to keep your trees, shrubbery, mailboxes, etc. from protruding past the curb into the street area. There are many maintenance activities that must occur close to the curb (snow plowing, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, etc.) which can be impacted by these obstructions.

STREET CLEANING

Street cleaning usually gets started soon after winter maintenance ends. It is a continuous process that does not end until all streets (except state roads) have been cleaned.



EMERGENCIES

If you observe what would appear to be an emergency with sanitary sewers, roadways or storm water facilities, please call the Public Works Department from 7:00 am to 3:30 pm Monday through Friday at 717-741-3861 ext. 170. After these hours or on weekends & holidays dial 911.

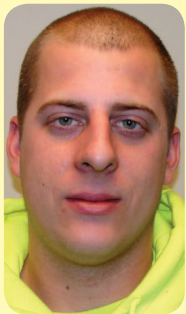

TEMPORARY SHELTERS NEEDED

York Township Emergency Management Agency is looking for Faith Based Community Organizations (FBCO) that would be able to provide heating and/or cooling stations for the residents of York Township in an emergency situation where the residents may need to evacuate their homes due to the emergency situation. The most likely of those emergency situations is a power outage. During power outages in winter, temperatures inside homes may drop to a level where a family may need to seek shelter elsewhere until power can be restored. Likewise in the summer months, temperatures may go too high for families to stay in their homes without air conditioning. Please understand that we are not asking for FBCO to provide meals and/or overnight accommodations. We would just like to know that residents of York Township have a local place to go with chairs, tables, and bathroom facilities for short periods of time until which time the American Red Cross could establish a Mass Care Shelter. VOLUNTEER NEEDED

York Township Emergency Management Agency is looking for a York Township Resident that would be willing to join the staff of York Township EMA to fill the following volunteer position on the staff: Mass Care, Housing & Human Services Branch Director.

This position requires the volunteer to successfully pass a PA criminal background check, which any volunteer can obtain online at no cost to the volunteer. Attendance will be required at the regularly scheduled York Township EMA staff meetings that are held typically on the third Thursday of each month at 7:00 pm in the York Township Emergency Operations Center located on the lower level of the York Township Municipal Building.

Mass Care, Housing and Human Services Branch Director requires some background in Emergency Services; however the individual should not be an active participant in that Emergency Service at this time. This position also requires that Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) courses be completed within one year of joining the staff. These FEMA courses are online courses known as Incident Command System courses, i.e. ICS700, National Incident Management System (NIMS).

STORMWATER NEWS

PROTECTING OUR WATERWAYS IN WINTER



Winter is here, and with it comes inclement weather and the need to de-ice roads. In York Township, our goal is to prevent pollution from reaching our waterways. In order to do so, the Township produces and utilizes

salt brine before inclement weather as an anti-icing or pre-treating procedure, and after weather events while applying rock salt. Salt brine is a solution of salt and water which reduces the adhesion of snow and ice to road surfaces. After inclement weather, pre-wetting (the practice of spraying brine onto rock salt as it hits the road) gets the salt "working" more quickly, helps it stay on the road after it is sprayed, and decreases the total amount of rock salt being used.

The reduction in salt applied to roads is beneficial to water quality. Similar to rain, snowmelt has the potential to travel into our storm drains and streams. By making smart decisions, we can prevent stormwater pollution.

Following these tips can help keep our water clean and protect the environment:

- ❄ While winterizing your vehicles, make sure to check for and fix fluid leaks. Also, make sure to properly dispose of antifreeze and never dump it on the ground or down a storm drain.

- ❄ Dispose of shoveled snow in vegetated areas; never dump it into streets or streams. The more water that can be absorbed by plants or sink into the ground, the less water will run off and convey pollutants into streams.
- ❄ Use safe and effective alternatives to de-icer, and follow the application rate on the label. Examples of alternatives include sand to help gain traction, beet juice, and rubbing alcohol.
- ❄ Road salt should always be stored in a water tight container.

2018 RECYCLING & TRASH INFO



CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Curbside yard waste collection will resume on March 24, 2018. Please follow these guidelines when placing yard waste for collection:

Place curbside by 6:00 am on the designated Saturdays.

The hauler starts promptly at 6:00 am and quickly moves through the township as they do not need to stop at every residence.

Yard waste includes material such as tree trimmings, shrubbery and other organic landscape vegetation no larger than 8" in diameter. Yard waste **DOES NOT** include: grass clippings, weeds, fruit and vegetable scraps, tree stumps, dirt and stones, or any trash or recyclable materials.

Prepare for collection: Place yard waste in biodegradable brown craft bags or bundle with biodegradable twine in bundles no longer than 4 feet in length, not weighing more than 50 pounds. You may also use the round blue 32 gallon recycle bins or similar 32 gallon can without a lid. The yard waste must be visible to the hauler.

Yard waste in plastic bags or mobile carts **will not** be collected on the designated Saturday yard waste collection days.

RESIDENTIAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents **ONLY** and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8 am to noon at the Small Load Drop-off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center, 2700 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406. ACCEPTED ITEMS:

- Computer – Devices PCs/Laptops/Servers
- Monitors / Televisions
- Networking Devices
- Printing Devices
- Receivers
- Communication Devices
- Power Supplies
- Batteries – Alkaline, lead acid, lithium ion, etc.

NOT ACCEPTED:

- Any fossil fuel or materials used in collecting fossil fuels.
- Any infectious or biological waste
- Any media contaminated with oil.
- Any chemicals, oils, or powders.
- Any equipment that contains chemicals of any kind.

RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) item shall be placed curbside **no earlier than 5:00 pm** on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be **removed no later than 12:00 midnight** in the evening in which collection occurs. Important guidelines to keep in mind for residential trash collection services are as follows:

Basic Service: Includes three (3) 23-gallon bags or cans of trash, unlimited recycling, and one large (bulk) item per week, as well as monthly curbside yard waste collection. Cost of this service is \$35.77 per **quarter**.

Cart Service: Includes one (1) 96-gallon cart of trash (only carts provided by Penn Waste), unlimited recycling, and one large (bulk) item per week, as well as monthly curbside yard waste collection. Cost of this service is \$54.77 per **quarter**.

Large (Bulk) Items: If your waste collection falls under the Township residential contract (directly billed by Penn Waste), you are entitled to place one large (bulk) item out per week with your regular trash and recycling. You only need to contact Penn Waste in advance if the item contains refrigerant (i.e. refrigerator, dehumidifier, air conditioner). Bulk items are those which cannot be disposed in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people (i.e. sofa, mattress, carpet, etc.) **Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their rent or condo/homeowners fee must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.**

Round Recycling Bins: Are the property of York Township, not the contracted hauler. The bins should remain with the property if sold. The bins are partially funded through a State recycling grant. If you never received a 32-gallon bin and you are billed directly by Penn Waste, you may pick one up at the Township offices. If your bin is cracked or broken, you must bring it to the Township office to obtain another bin. Additional bins may be purchased for a fee of \$7.50. Recycling bin stickers are available free-of-charge for those who wish to provide their own smaller bin for recycling.

If you are not directly billed by Penn Waste and your refuse service is provided through your landlord, condo association, or homeowner's association, you must contact the landlord or association to get a recycling bin through your refuse hauler.

Recyclables must be placed in a separate bin from trash and are picked up on your regular trash day. Replacement bins are available at the Township Administrative Office or the Public Works Department.

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING

CAN Be Included:

Metal- aluminum beverage cans, steel food and beverage cans, empty aerosol cans, empty paint cans

Glass- clear, brown, and green glass food and beverage containers

Plastics- All plastics #1-#7 accepted. All materials must be thoroughly cleaned before placing in your bin

Paper, Paperboard & Cardboard- all sizes of cardboard boxes flattened, pizza boxes, food boxes (i.e. cereal & Jell-O boxes), empty paper towel and toilet paper rolls, paperboard packaging (i.e. tissue boxes), office paper (any color), newspaper and inserts, magazines/catalogs/brochures, envelopes and junk mail, paper bags, phone books and other soft cover books

Paperboard Cartons- milk, juice, soup, wine, broth, cream, egg substitutes

CANNOT Be included:

- **NEEDLES-DO NOT** place used needles with recycling! This is a serious health hazard to everyone!
- Broken glass, light bulbs
- Windows, mirror, ceramics
- Drinking glasses
- Aluminum foil
- Scrap metal
- Tupperware
- Plastic tableware (knives, forks, spoons, etc.)
- Plastic grocery bags, plastic food wrappers
- All solvent, oil, and chemical containers
- Food-soiled materials
- Used paper towels or tissues
- Styrofoam, packing peanuts
- Pool chemicals
- Plastic bubble wrap
- Shredded paper



Commercial Recycling is required by law.

Pennsylvania State Act 101 of 1988 and York Township Ordinance 2006-12 require nonresidential establishments to recycle. Nonresidential establishments include all commercial, municipal, institutional, and community groups that do not fit into a residential category. To comply with the State and Local laws, you are required to recycle the following items:

- **Aluminum**
- **Steel and bimetallic cans**
- **High-Grade Office Paper**
- **Corrugated Paper** (cardboard)
- **Glass** (clear, brown and green)
- **Leaf waste**

Please Do Not Place Any Plastic Bags Curbside In Your Recycle Bins!

Plastic bags should be recycled at local grocery stores, Bon-Ton, Walmart, Target, etc.



BRUSH RECYCLING

Brush is defined as tree limbs, shrubbery and the like no larger than 8" in diameter. York Township accepts brush from Township residents as part of our recycling efforts.

The drop off site is located at the Township Campus beyond the gate between the two signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

The site will be opened for self-serve (unassisted) use only for 4 consecutive days in the months of November, December, January and February. It starts the first full weekend of the month beginning on the first Friday at 7:30 am closing at 3:00 pm on the following Monday. All drop offs will be unassisted. Daily hours are dawn to dusk.

We ask that you participate in this program responsibly by not dumping unlawful items at the site. Examples are garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings etc.

All other material and items you see beyond the gate are for Township use only and are not meant for the general public to use or take. If you see a violation please report it to the Township or York Area Regional Police Department. The site is under constant video surveillance.

Public Works will process the brush into mulch which will be made available to Township residents free of charge. The mulch pile is located in front of the gate (left side). DO NOT drive past the gate when the site is closed as indicated by the red sign on the left gate. Mulch may not be available at all times. The mulch availability and the times and dates of brush recycling are subject to change at Township discretion.

WASTE OIL COLLECTION

Waste oil may be dropped off at the Public Works Service Building Monday – Friday from 7:30 am - 3:00 pm. Please do not drop off oil after hours.

Stroke is a brain attack. Like a heart attack can damage and kill heart muscle, a stroke does just that to your brain. If you know the signs and symptoms of a stroke, you are a step closer to getting the immediate medical treatment for you or a loved one when literally minutes count.

The signs and symptoms can include:

- Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg on one side of the body.
- Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding.
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes.
- Sudden trouble walking, loss of balance, dizziness or coordination.
- Sudden severe headache with no known cause.

For each moment a stroke goes untreated and blood flow is blocked from the brain, a person loses 1.9 million neurons. This means a person's speech, movement, memory and more can be affected.

Knowing and recognizing the signs and symptoms of a stroke will determine how quickly someone will receive medical help.

Use **FAST** as an easy tool for identifying warning signs of a stroke.

F = Face: Ask the person to smile. Does one side droop?

A = Arms: Ask the person to lift both arms. Does one of them drift down?

S = Speech: Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase. Like, don't cry over spilled milk.

T = Time: If you see any of these signs, call 9-1-1 immediately.

Anyone can have a stroke. Everyone should be ready. Learn the warning signs and remember **F.A.S.T.**

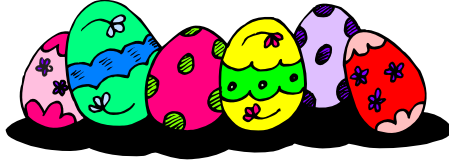

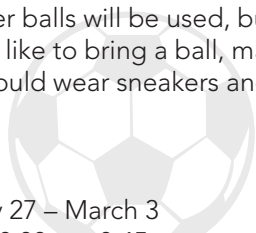

- **ADVANCE PAYMENT** is required for all programs as it will ensure a space in the class/program. Checks may be made payable to York Township.
- **PARTICIPATION** in any class/program/event constitutes permission to use likeness in promotional materials.
- **THE DEPARTMENT** is **NOT** responsible for injuries while participating in any of its activities.
- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician will be required. No refunds for Bus Trips will be given when spots are cancelled less than 30 days before trip unless the trip is cancelled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- **PROGRAM SIZE** is limited and will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.
- **PROGRAM DATES & TIMES** are contingent on availability of facilities and are subject to change.
- **PROGRAMS** postponed or not held by the instructor due to emergencies will be made up by the instructor or fees will be prorated. Classes missed by the participant will not be made up.
- **POLICY ON CHILDREN**—Participants are not permitted to bring children with them to class. Enrollment age is included with the description of most of the classes.
- **CANCELLATIONS**—In case of inclement weather, we may cancel our programs. Remember, if the Dallastown Area School District cancels classes, then our activities are cancelled also. The YTRec Hotline number is 717-741-3861 ext. 350 and it is typically updated by 4 pm when needed for cancellations/field closures.
- **MIN/MAX**—There is a minimum number of participants needed before a class can “go.” If a sufficient number does not register, the class will be cancelled. Ensure your choice—register now!

PARK RULES / HOURS

1. ALL Parks are closed between dusk and dawn, with the exception of York Township Park. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
2. No littering.
3. No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
4. **NO GOLFING IN PARKS.** Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
5. Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned.
6. No solicitation.
7. **No alcoholic beverages or drugs.** No one permitted in the area under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs.
8. **Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, rifles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.**
9. Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
10. Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
11. No facilities may be reserved without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
12. Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
13. Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
14. **No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game trucks, etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.**
