MS4 Annual Report Presentation and Training

Molly Eck presented the MS4 Annual Report. A copy of her powerpoint presentation is included in the minute book. There were approximately 28 people in the audience for the presentation and training. There were no questions from the Board or the audience on the information presented. The Board thanked Molly for the presentation and her work with the MS4 program in York Township.

Stormwater Authority

Mr. Milbrand reported he receive some information of concern about the possibility of a small regional stormwater consortium and would like to defer any action on this subject matter at this time.

Transfer of PA liquor License to Sheetz at 2068 S. Queen Street

The Township received a request for a public hearing to transfer a liquor license from York City to York Township to be located at the Sheetz at 2068 S. Queen Street. The Board agreed to hold a public hearing on Tuesday, March 13th, 2018 at 7:00 pm.

PennDOT Country Club Road widening & sewer replacement project (Resolutions 2018-2 & 2018-3)

On January 23rd, at a PaOneCall York County Coordinating Committee Meeting, the Township was advised that PennDOT intends to widen Country Club Road at George Street to allow another turning lane. It was brought to PennDOT's attention that York Township owns sewers in that area and the Township intends to upsize our interceptor. A request was made, and staff is pursuing the option to upsize our interceptor in the PennDOT project area as an addendum to their project. Gannett Fleming developed a preliminary Construction Cost estimate that puts project cost in the range of \$336,000. It will be significantly cheaper to perform this upsize with the PennDOT project now verses in the future. An estimate was received in the range of an additional \$400,000 to \$600,000 for just boring if the Township does not participate with PennDOT on their project. A discussion was held.

Resolution 2018-2 PennDOT Traffic HOP (Country Club Road Sewer Replacement.) - On motion of Comm. Jones, seconded by Comm. Granholm, the Board approved to partner with PennDOT and engage Gannett Fleming to perform the steps necessary to upsize the Tyler Run Interceptor under Country Club Road and approve Resolution 2018-2 for a Highway Occupancy permit for the new sanitary sewers under Country Club Road.

Resolution 2018-3 Sewer Fund Balance Transfer - On motion of Comm. Steele, seconded by Comm. Jones, the Board approved Resolution 2018-3 to reduce the “Sewer Fund Capital Project” fund balance by \$350,000 and increase the “Tyler Run design and construction capital project” expense line item number 30-406-429 by \$350,000.

Request for support letter to study accidents on Cape Horn Road

On motion of Comm. Kessler, seconded by Comm. Knepper, the Board approved sending a joint letter to PennDOT District 8 requesting a traffic study be performed to determine whether any traffic improvements can be made to reduce the number of motor vehicle accidents that are occurring along Cape Horn Road.

Chambers Road Green Light Go Grant

On February 9, 2018, Township staff received notification that we did not receive a multimodal grant for the Chambers Road realignment. No municipality in York County received grant funding. The next round of Multimodal Transportation Fund applications opens on February 26, 2018, with applications due on March 30, 2018.

On motion of Comm. Kessler, seconded by Comm. Jones, the Board authorized the Township to submit a new Multimodal Transportation Fund application for the for the Chambers Road realignment.

Solid Waste and Recycling Contract

The bids for the solid waste and recycling contract were opened on Monday, February 12th, 2018. Republic Services is the apparent lowest responsible, responsive bidder. Stock and Leader will need to review the bid packets for completeness. The mobile refuse cart rentals are not in the current Township contract, and a waste hauler can charge any fee they want for a mobile refuse cart rental. For the new contract, we added the rental rates as a requirement of the bid specification but did not add it in under the determination of the lowest bidder. After a review of the bid specifications and bids, it is my recommendation that we reject all bids and rebid the refuse contract to include the mobile refuse cart rental in determining the lowest responsible bidder.

On a motion from Comm. Jones, seconded by Comm. Knepper, the Township Manager was directed to reject all bids and rebid the refuse contract in order to include the rental fee associated with the refuse mobile carts as a cost element when determining the lowest responsible, responsive bidder.
