From the Manager's Desk

Updates on various projects and Township news from
November 2017 to March 2018

The York Township Board of Commissioners passed the 2018 budget.

The Board made the following appointments:

- Raymond Fertig to the Planning Commission through December 2021
- Carl Dallmeyer as citizen-at-large to York Area Regional Police (YARP) for 2018
- Karen Atkinson and Edmund Dick to Water & Sewer Authority through December 2022

After the swearing in of Comm. Jones and Comm. Granholm, the Board reorganized as follows: Comm. Steele-Board President, Comm. Jones-Board Vice President, Gary Milbrand-Township Secretary, Kay Crumling-Treasurer, JMT- Township Engineer, Stock and Leader-Township Solicitor.

The York Township Water and Sewer Authority demolished a building in preparation for a new Green Valley Road Pumping Station.

The Township received the contract for the third Green Light Go Grant. This grant is for the signal improvements at Queen Street and Country Club Road.

The Equipment Storage Building was upgraded with a new CO and NO2 monitoring system.

The Township entered into a new contract with Penn Waste for residential garbage and recycling collection for the next 4 years. Further details can be found within the newsletter.

The Board approved a resolution opposing the Pennsylvania Supreme Court draft Congressional Map dated February 19, 2018 because it splits York Township into two Congressional districts.

The Board agreed to partner with PennDOT to perform the steps necessary to upsize the Township Sewer Authority's Tyler Run Interceptor under Country Club Road.

The Board approved the inter-municipal transfer of liquor licenses into York Township to be used at the Sheetz at 2068 S. Queen Street and at the Rutter's at 2490 Cape Horn Road.

York Township, along with YARP and Windsor Township, requested PennDOT to perform a traffic study concerning motor vehicle accidents that are occurring along Cape Horn Road.

The Board approved (with conditions) the following plans:

- Preliminary and Final Land Development Plan for Taco Bell (2054 S. Queen St.)
- Lot Line Adjustment Plan for South Branch LP & PW Capital LLC (Water St.)
- Lot Line Adjustment Plan and Final Land Development Plan for parking expansion for OSS Realty Company (1855 Powder Mill Rd.)
- Final Land Development Plan for Wyndridge Farms Patio Enclosure and Addition (847 S. Pleasant Ave.)

The Board approved a zoning map amendment for 141 Monument Road to residential low density.

The Board approved the purchase of the following: a 2019 tandem axle Freightliner with accessory equipment for \$296,311; a Ventrac mower for \$42,631.64; a propane powered forklift for \$19,976; a 2018 Ford F-350 pickup truck for \$29,722.00 and a 2018 Ford Escape for \$22,582.

NEW PA LAW REGULATING FIREWORKS

House Bill 542 was signed into law on October 30, 2017, amending Pennsylvania's Fireworks Law and greatly expanding the ability of the general public to purchase and use consumer fireworks. The most noteworthy changes are highlighted below:

- Consumers can now purchase and use "Class C" or "consumer-grade" fireworks that include firecrackers, Roman Candles, bottle rockets, and similar fireworks that contain a maximum of 50 milligrams of explosive material. The expansion includes those fireworks that were previously only available to out-of-state residents. ("Display fireworks," which are classified as including salutes that contain more than two grains or 130 milligrams of explosive materials, and professional-grade aerial shells containing more than 60 grams of pyrotechnic compositions, are still only to be used by professionals with a permit from the municipality where the display will take place.)
- Any person who is at least 18 years of age may purchase consumer fireworks.
- Prohibitions. A person may not intentionally ignite or discharge:
 - (1) Consumer fireworks on public or private property without the express permission of the owner.
 - (2) Consumer fireworks or sparkling devices within, or throw consumer fireworks or sparkling devices from, a motor vehicle or building.
 - (3) Consumer fireworks or sparkling devices into or at a motor vehicle or building or at another person.
 - (4) Consumer fireworks or sparkling devices while the person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance or another drug.
 - (5) Consumer fireworks within 150 feet of an occupied structure.
- Consumer fireworks can be purchased at any licensed facility, including temporary tents that appear in parking lots around July 4th of each year. Licenses are issued by the PA Department of Agriculture.

YARD SALES

Please keep the following in mind when planning the date for your next big yard sale:

Frequency and duration requirements; permissible and prohibited sales. Two yard sales are permissible per household in any twelve-month period. The maximum duration of each sale shall be two consecutive calendar days between the hours of 9:00 am and 9:00 pm prevailing time. No merchandise intended to be sold shall be displayed on the premises except for one hour before and during the hours of sale. No amplified sounds shall be permitted in connection with the sale.

Permits. No yard sale may be held until a permit therefore has been obtained. The permit cost shall be as established from time to time by the Board of Commissioners.



All permit fees shall be paid to the township prior to issuance of the permit. The permit granted by the township shall be prominently displayed on the premises during the sale.

On-site garage/yard sale signs.

Maximum permitted number – 2 per sale

Maximum permitted sign area – 6 square feet per sign

Permitted time frame – Between 2 days prior to and during the sale. No more than 2 consecutive periods totaling 12 days during any calendar year.

Off-site garage/yard sale signs with written permission of landowner.

Maximum permitted number – 2 per sale, 1 per property

Maximum permitted sign area – 1 square foot per sign

Permitted time frame – Only on the day of the sale. No more than 4 days during any calendar year.

JUST A REMINDER

Just a friendly reminder to the property owners in York Township. It is your responsibility to keep your trees, shrubbery, mailboxes, etc. from protruding past the curb into the street area. There are many maintenance activities that must occur close to the curb (snow plowing, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, etc.) which can be impacted by these obstructions. Overgrown trees and shrubbery can also impact the sight distance for the motoring public. Refer to Ordinance # 2014-5 found on the website for more details.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR 2017:

- The York County Access and Functional Needs Person Registry Forms were revised to be pertinent to York Township.
- York Township EOC was successfully activated on March 13th in anticipation of a Snow Storm.
- York Township EMA sponsored three FCC Amateur Radio Licensing Classes at York Township.
- Two York Township EMA Staff members obtained Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency Professional Certification.
- York Township Staff members participated in testing of equipment in the York Township EOC Communications Room.
- A template for a Continuity of Operations Plan for York Township Municipal Operations has been completed.
- An Emergency Operations Plan specific to Mobile Home Parks was completed.
- The Chief Operating Officer at OSS, the Director of Quality/Risk Management at OSS and the Director of Emergency Management for Wellspan Facilities now attend the monthly meetings of the York Township EMA Staff.
- York Township EMA and the following municipalities have updated Memorandums of Agreement to share resources during an emergency: Dallastown Borough, Red Lion Borough and Jacobus Borough.
- Three new Memorandums of Agreement for Faith Based Community Organizations to serve as Heating and/or Cooling Stations (Temporary Shelters) were approved by the York Township BOC.
- Per the National Incident Management System (NIMS) all Fire, EMS, Police and Public Works equipment needs to be typed per FEMA Typed Resource Definitions. This typing was completed and included in the York Township Notification and Resource Manual (NARM).
- Public Event Alert Notification was prepared for five events in York Township.

- A search and rescue jump bag has been equipped.
- York Township EMA Staff attended the South Central Task Force Evacuation Planning Workshop.
- York Township EMA Staff supported Northern York EOC during the April TMI Emergency Exercise.
- York Township EMC participated in the Wellspan Surgery and Rehabilitation Hospital Hazard and Vulnerability Analysis Review.
- York Township Staff Members participated in a Wellspan Surgery and Rehabilitation Hospital Emergency Communication Notification/Actions Taken Exercise.
- Significant progress was made this year in completion of a York Township Parks and Recreation Emergency Operation Plan.

GOALS FOR 2018:

- Completion of the COOP, Continuity of Operations Plan, for York Township Municipal Operations
- Completion of the York Township Parks and Recreation EOP
- Attend the Governor's Summit on Emergency Preparedness
- Continue to support the rewrite of Title 35 (Health and Safety) – PA Consolidated Statutes – Part V. Emergency Management Services – Chapters 71-77
- Continue to pursue Faith Based Community Organizations in order to complete Memorandums of Agreement for those organizations to become Local Municipal Heating/Cooling Stations (Temporary Shelters)

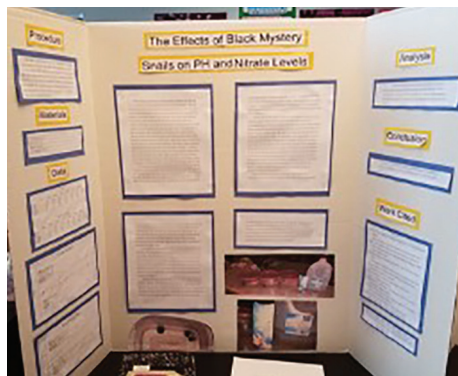

2018 DALLASTOWN AREA HIGH SCHOOL SCIENCE & ENGINEERING FAIR WINNERS

York Township congratulates the 2018 York Township Science & Engineering Fair scholarship winners. York Township provides scholarships for the best junior and senior "Water Quality or Stormwater Management Project" as part of our stormwater management program.

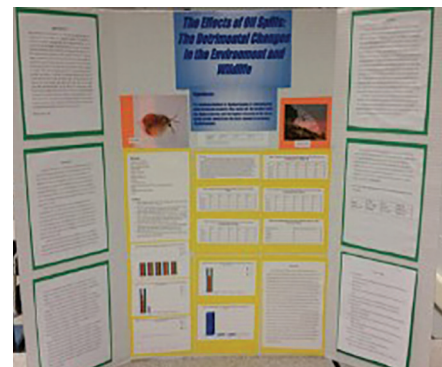
The senior project winner selected was "The Effects of Snails on pH and Nitrate Levels," by **Jonathan Salvatore**.

The purpose of Jonathan's experiment was to test the effects of snail decomposition on the levels of both nitrate and pH in water without the presence of bacteria which convert ammonia to nitrite; making water slightly less harmful to aquatic life.



The junior project winner selected was "The Effects of Oil Spills: Detrimental Changes in the Environment and Wildlife," by **Aniruth Ramanathan**.

The purpose of Aniruth's experiment was to understand what kind of petroleum product would be the most dangerous if involved in an oil spill, by introducing three products (motor oil, diesel, and gasoline) to a small simulated environment for *Daphnia magna*, a common species for ecotoxicology.

RESIDENTIAL CAR WASHING & POOL WATER DISCHARGES

RESIDENTIAL CAR WASHING



As part of the Township's new 2018 Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit, discharge of water resulting from residential (not commercial) car washing to the MS4 is authorized only when cleaning agents are not utilized. The definition of "cleaning agent" is listed as "any product, substance, or chemical other than water that is used to clean the exterior surface of vehicles."

Consequently, residential vehicle washing with cleaning agents is acceptable where the wash water would not flow into storm sewers. Residential vehicle washing without cleaning agents is also acceptable.

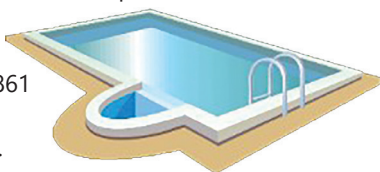
IF YOU CHOOSE TO WASH YOUR CAR AT HOME, HERE ARE A FEW TIPS:

1. Wash on grass or gravel, not on a paved driveway or street.
2. Minimize the amount of water you use by using a hose nozzle with a trigger.
3. Reduce the amount of soap you use.
4. Do not rinse sponges and wash rags onto the ground but into buckets, then pour the buckets of soapy water down the sink or on grass when finished.

POOL WATER DISCHARGES

As part of the Township's new 2018 Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit, discharge of non-chlorinated swimming pool, hot tub, and/or spa water directly to the storm sewer system, and ultimately to local streams, is no longer authorized. The best approach for managing these wastewaters is disposal into a public sewer system or at a sewage treatment facility, with authorization of the sewer system owner.

IF POOL WATER CANNOT BE HAULED AWAY AND YOU MUST DRAIN YOUR POOL, FOLLOW THE TIPS LISTED BELOW:

1. Prior to draining, shut off the chlorination system or do not add any chlorine.
2. Hold the water in the pool or hot tub for two weeks to reduce the chlorine level.
3. Drain water onto a landscaped area of your property away from your storm drains.
4. When draining, be considerate of your neighbor by keeping all water on your property. You can do so by using sand bags or berms if necessary.
5. Do not drain if there has been recent application of herbicides, pesticides, or fertilizers on your lawn.

CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Please follow these guidelines when placing yard waste for collection: Place curbside by **6:00 am** on the designated Saturdays. The hauler starts promptly at 6:00 am and quickly moves through the township as they do not need to stop at every residence.

Yard waste includes material such as tree trimmings, shrubbery and other organic landscape vegetation no larger than 8" in diameter. Yard waste DOES NOT include: grass clippings, weeds, fruit and vegetable scraps, tree stumps, dirt and stones, or any trash or recyclable materials.

Prepare for collection: Place yard waste in biodegradable brown craft bags or bundle with biodegradable twine in bundles no longer than 4 feet in length, not weighing more than 50 pounds. You may also use the round blue 32 gallon recycle bins or similar 32 gallon can without a lid. The yard waste must be visible to the hauler.

Yard waste in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected on the designated Saturday yard waste collection days.

RESIDENTIAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents ONLY and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to noon at the Small Load Drop-off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406. ACCEPTED ITEMS:

- Computer – Devices PCs/Laptops/Servers
- Monitors / Televisions
- Networking Devices
- Printing Devices
- Receivers
- Communication Devices
- Power Supplies

NOT ACCEPTED:

- Any fossil fuel or materials used in collecting fossil fuels.
- Any infectious or biological waste.
- Any media contaminated with oil.
- Any chemicals, oils, or powders.
- Any equipment that contains chemicals of any kind.

RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) item shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight in the evening in which collection occurs.

Important guidelines to keep in mind for residential trash collection services are as follows:

On April 10, 2018 the York Township Board of Commissioners awarded the residential trash collection contract to Penn Waste for the next four years. The quarterly fees for basic service of (3) 32-gallon bags or cans of trash, unlimited recycling with cart, one large item per week, 12 times per year curbside yard waste collection and a Township administration fee of \$1.50 are as follows:

July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019	= \$48.00 per quarter
July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020	= \$49.38 per quarter
July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021	= \$50.82 per quarter
July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022	= \$52.35 per quarter

The optional 96-gallon mobile trash cart rental fee will be:

July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019	= \$11.50 per quarter
July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020	= \$11.80 per quarter
July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021	= \$12.20 per quarter
July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022	= \$12.55 per quarter

The price for extra service bags will remain at \$4.00 each from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2020 and will increase to \$4.50 for July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2022.

Large (Bulk) Items: If your waste collection falls under the Township residential contract (directly billed by Penn Waste), you are entitled to place one large (bulk) item out per week with your regular trash and recycling. You only need to contact Penn Waste in advance if the item contains refrigerant (i.e. refrigerator, dehumidifier, air conditioner). Bulk items are those which cannot be disposed in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people (i.e. sofa, mattress, carpet, etc.) Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their rent or condo/homeowners fee must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.

Round Recycling Bins: Are the property of York Township, not the contracted hauler. The bins should remain with the property if sold. The bins are partially funded through a State recycling grant. If you never received a 32-gallon bin and you are billed directly by Penn Waste, you may pick one up at the Township offices. If your bin is cracked or broken, you must bring it to the Township office to obtain another bin. Additional bins may be purchased for a fee of \$7.50. Recycling bin stickers are available free-of-charge for those who wish to provide their own smaller bin for recycling.

If you are not directly billed by Penn Waste and your refuse service is provided through your landlord, condo association, or homeowner's association, you must contact the landlord or association to get a recycling bin through your refuse hauler.

Recyclables must be placed in a separate bin from trash and are picked up on your regular trash day. Replacement bins are available at the Township Administrative Office or the Public Works Department.

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING

CAN BE INCLUDED:

Metal – aluminum beverage cans, steel food and beverage cans, empty aerosol cans, empty paint cans

Glass – clear, brown, and green glass food and beverage containers

Plastics – all plastics #1-#7 accepted. All materials must be thoroughly cleaned before placing in your bin

Paper, Paperboard & Cardboard – all sizes of cardboard boxes flattened, pizza boxes, food boxes (i.e. cereal & Jell-O boxes), empty paper towel and toilet paper rolls, paperboard packaging (i.e. tissue boxes), office paper (any color), newspaper and inserts, magazines/catalogs/brochures, envelopes and junk mail, paper bags, phone books and other soft cover books

Paperboard Cartons – milk, juice, soup, wine, broth, cream, egg substitutes

CANNOT BE INCLUDED:

Soiled Materials – dirty diapers, wet cardboard, wet papers, food waste, food-soiled materials, used paper towels or tissues

Hazardous Materials & Medical Waste – all solvent, oil, chemical containers, propane tanks, pool chemicals, *batteries, and NEEDLES

Electronic Waste – computers, computer accessories, television, monitors, and e-readers

Packing Materials – styrofoam, packing peanuts, shredded paper, and bubble wrap

Lights & Glassware – light bulbs, strings of lights, drinking glasses, broken glass and mirrors

Miscellaneous – plastic tableware, tupperware, **plastic grocery bags, plastic food wrappers, aluminum foil, scrap metal, can lids, clothing hangers, hoses, windows, and ceramics

* Household (alkaline) batteries can be placed in the trash. Re-chargeable batteries can be recycled at select retailers.

** Plastic bags should be recycled at grocery stores and department stores, including Walmart, Target, etc.

COMMERCIAL RECYCLING IS REQUIRED BY LAW.

Pennsylvania State Act 101 of 1988 and York Township Ordinance 2006-12 require nonresidential establishments to recycle. Nonresidential establishments include all commercial, municipal, institutional, and community groups that do not fit into a residential category. To comply with the State and Local laws, you are required to recycle the following items:

- Aluminum
- Steel and bimetallic cans
- High-Grade Office Paper
- Corrugated Paper (cardboard)
- Glass (clear, brown and green)
- Leaf waste



RESIDENTIAL BRUSH DROP OFF

Brush is defined as tree limbs, shrubbery and the like no larger than 8" in diameter. York Township accepts brush from Township residents (no commercial participation permitted) as part of our recycling efforts.

The drop off site is located at the Township Municipal Complex beyond the gate between the two designated signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road, for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

During the months of March through October, the drop off site will be open for 15 consecutive days beginning on the first Monday of the month at 7:30 am ending on the third Monday at 3:00 pm. All drop offs will be unassisted. Hours of operation are dawn to dusk.

The site will be opened for self-serve (unassisted) use only for 4 consecutive days in the months of November, December, January and February. It starts the first full weekend of the month beginning on the first Friday at 7:30 am and closing at 3 pm on the following Monday. All drop offs will be unassisted. Hours of operation are dawn to dusk.

November 5, 2018 @ 3:00 pm

December 7, 2018 @ 7:30 am through

December 10, 2018 @ 3:00 pm

The brush will be ground into mulch and will be made available to Township residents free of charge. The mulch pile is located near the main gate (left side).

All other material and items located beyond the gate are Township Property and are not meant for the general public to use or take. If you see a violation, please report it to the Township or York Area Regional Police Department. The site is under 24 hour video surveillance and routinely monitored. We ask that you participate in this program responsibly by not dumping items such as garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings, etc.

DO NOT Drive past the gate when the site is closed as indicated by the red sign on the left gate. The mulch availability and the site opening dates and times are subject to change at the Township's discretion.

WASTE OIL COLLECTION

Waste oil may be dropped off at the Public Works Service Building Monday – Friday from 7:30 am – 3:00 pm. Please do not drop off oil after hours.

Tips for keeping you, your family and friends safe this summer.

No matter the outdoor activity be aware of becoming over-exposed to the sun. Stay hydrated! Drink plenty of fluids and seek air conditioning if you become overheated. Pace yourself in the heat and sun, and definitely have lots of fun.

Backyard Playground – Your backyard should be a fun and safe place for you and your family. Start with your children's play equipment. Be sure swing sets are on level ground and properly anchor legs. Watch your children while they are on play sets, tree houses, etc. Check the temperature of slides and swings. They can get very hot and even cause burns.

Parents should seriously consider not purchasing home trampolines or allow your children to use them because of the serious risk for injury. Trampolines with the surrounding netting offer a false sense of security and do not prevent many trampoline-related injuries. Most injuries happen on the trampoline and not from falling off.

Mowing – Only use push mowers with a control that stops the blades when you let go of the handle. Keep all safety devices such as switches and shields in proper working order. Riding mowers with safety shut off when not seated should never be disabled. Lawn mowers cause more than 80,000 injuries a year.

Grilling, Barbequing and Fire Pits – Never use your grill or fire pits in your home or garage. Keep children and pets away from any open flame or hot surface. Keep your grill on a level surface away from the house and other flammable objects. If using charcoal, be sure to extinguish the coals completely before discarding and always put them in a metal container. *"In 2009-2013, U.S. fire departments responded to an average of 8,900 home fires involving grills, hibachis, or barbecues per year, including an average of 3,900 structure fires and 5,100 outside fires."*

Bugs – Do not use scented soaps, perfumes or hair spray on yourself or child. Avoid areas concentrated with insect nests or places they congregate such as pooling water, foods and places where flowers grow. Never let the water of bird baths or fish ponds become stagnant. Dump items that may collect water during rain storms.

Remove visible bee stingers with a credit card or fingernail. Carefully back it out by scraping with the card or nail. Try to avoid combination sunscreens with insect repellents. Sunscreens will need to be reapplied far more times than the repellent.

Pools – Pools, ponds and standing water can be serious and even deadly hazards. If you have a pool or even a small pond in your yard, you should install a fence, minimum of 5 feet high with a self-latching gate. Don't keep furniture or other items that could be climbed on near the fence. Pool alarms are never a bad idea. They will alert you that anyone or anything has entered the pool. Never let children outside with a pool or pond unsupervised even for a minute. Never leave toys in or near the pool. These items can be tempting to kids.

Bicycles – "Under state law, children under age 12 must wear a helmet while riding a bicycle." Pennsylvania's mandatory bicycle helmet law applies to children operating bicycles and to children who are passengers in a bicycle restraining seat or trailer." No matter how short the ride, your child needs to wear a helmet. Many injuries happen in your own driveway, sidewalks and bike paths, not just on streets. Children learn from example. Everyone should wear a helmet. Set a good example and wear a helmet whenever you ride.

Fireworks – Fireworks can cause blindness, severe burns, scars and even death. Many fireworks such as sparklers can reach temperatures over 1000 degrees Fahrenheit and can burn users and bystanders. Families should attend public displays handled by professionals rather than at home.

Providing 24-hour emergency ambulance service is costly. York Township tax dollars comprise less than 5% of each agency's operating budget; most of the operating costs are paid for by billing the patient for the service provided to them. Ambulance service is not a free municipal service. The charge for paramedic level advanced life support treatment and transportation may exceed \$1,200, depending on the nature of the illness/injury and the services provided. In most cases, health insurance does not pay the entire bill. The patient is responsible for the remaining balance or "co-pay." This is where the benefits offered by an ambulance subscription become very evident.

Those individuals and households that are subscribers are not responsible for any "out of pocket" expenses for emergency ambulance transportation. The amount that is paid by your insurance is considered payment in full, if you are a subscriber. To remain available for 911 emergencies, our ambulance service does not provide routine scheduled non-emergency ambulance transportation.

Please Note: If our ambulances are on other emergency calls, York County 911 will send the next appropriate available ambulance. The individual EMS companies have no control over who is sent when 911 is called. Routine transports are not included with our subscriptions.

811 - PA ONE CALL

Safe Digging: If you plan to dig for any reason, you must call 811 at least three days before digging to get your underground utilities marked.

The national "Call Before You Dig" number, 811, connects homeowners and contractors with the Pennsylvania One Call System. This organization informs utility companies of a homeowner's intent to dig and provides the opportunity for utility companies to mark buried pipes and cables before digging commences, protecting both the utility lines and homeowners.

No matter how large or small the project is, it's important to know what's below. Call 811 if you are installing a fence or deck, or digging for a mailbox post, patio, or other excavation project. Calling 811 can prevent a potentially dangerous situation, as well as saving homeowners and contractors potentially costly repair bills.

This service is free for homeowners, and it's the law. The 811 "Call Before You Dig" hotline operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year.

Sewer Line Safety: Additionally, it is important that you or your plumber call 811 prior to clearing a blocked sewer line.

Sewer lines are sometimes not marked or incorrectly marked, leaving the potential for natural gas lines to be installed through sewer lines. If a sewer backup develops, a plumber or homeowner often attempts to clear the blockage by using a mechanical rotary device. This can damage the utility line and create an unsafe situation allowing natural gas to migrate into homes and buildings.

Before you or your plumber attempt to clear a blocked sewer line, call 811 to have your sewer and gas lines located and inspected.

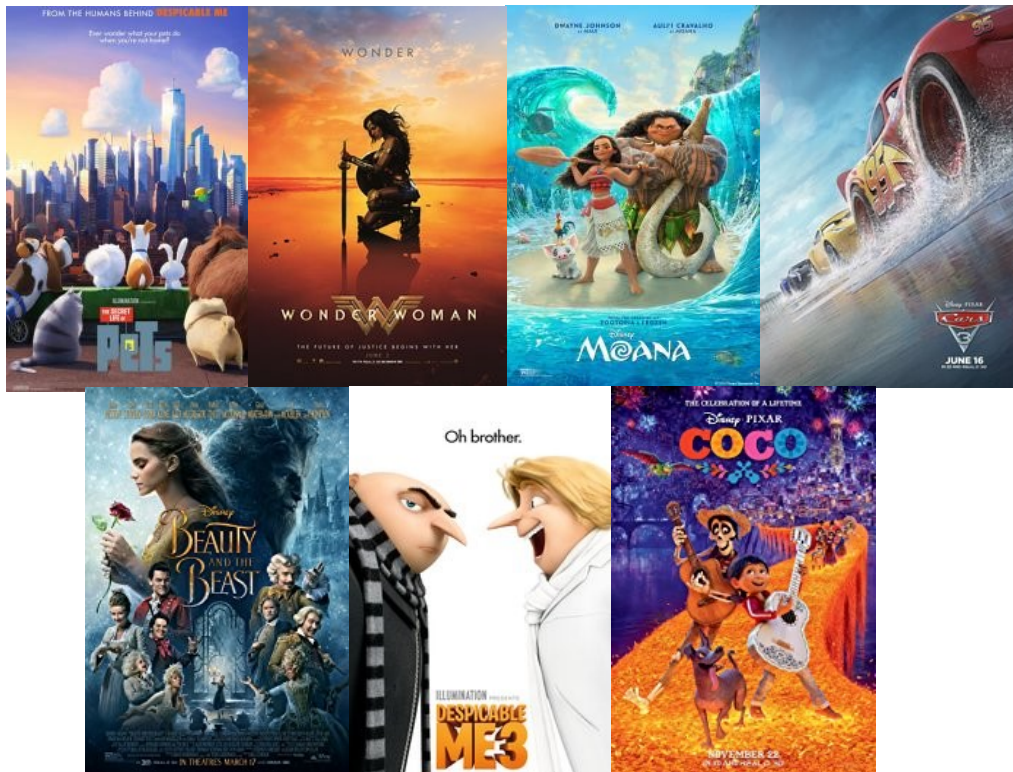

- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician will be required. No refunds for Bus Trips will be given when spots are cancelled less than 30 days before trip unless the trip is cancelled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- **PROGRAM SIZE** is limited and will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.

PARK RULES / HOURS

1. ALL Parks are closed between dusk and dawn, with the exception of York Township Park. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
2. No littering.
3. No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
4. **NO GOLFING IN PARKS.** Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
5. Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned.
6. No solicitation.
7. **No alcoholic beverages or drugs.** No one permitted in the area under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs.
8. **Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, rifles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.**
9. Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
10. Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
11. No facilities may be reserved without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
12. Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
13. Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
14. **No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game trucks, etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.**
