

FROM THE MANAGER'S DESK

Updates on various projects and Township news from December 2018 to March 2019

The Board appointed Commissioner Granholm representative and Commissioner Knepper alternate to the Police Commission with a term to expire January 4, 2021.

The Board appointed Ryan Grigg representative and Gary Milbrand alternate to the York Adams Tax Bureau and York County Tax Collection.

The Board approved Ryan Grigg representative to the York Township employee pension plan.

The Board appointed Jodi Heffner to the Planning Commission for a term expiring December 2022 and Zane Williams to the Water & Sewer Authority for a term expiring December 31, 2023.

The Board appointed Bridgett McAuliffe, Walter Henry, Jr. and Nicholas Sabold to the Property Maintenance Appeals Board.

The Board approved the following resolutions:

- Resolution 2018-16 appointing the independent auditor for 2018 fiscal year.
- Resolution 2018-17 appointment of Anthony Pantano as an alternate to the Zoning Hearing Board.

The Board directed the Township Manager to write a letter to the York County Commissioners in opposition to the creation of a County Stormwater Authority.

The Board approved the signing of the acknowledgment by the York Township Goodwill Fire Company to enter into a new loan agreement.

The Board approved, with conditions, the 3100 Cape Horn Road Preliminary/Final Subdivision Plan and Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan.

The Board approved, with conditions, the Dean and Carol Nachtigall Preliminary/Final Subdivision Plan, located at 2470 Indian Rock Dam Road.

The Board approved, with conditions, the U.S. Renal Care Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan, located at 2721 South Queen Street.

The Board approved, with conditions, the Gary and Susan Alcorn Final Subdivision Plan, located at 2653 South George Street.

The Board approved, with conditions, the WellSpan Heart and Vascular Center Final Lot Consolidation Plan, located at 2301 Joppa Road.

YORK TOWNSHIP EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY



CERT TRAINING

CERT training, as defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, promotes a partnering effort between emergency services and the people that they serve. The goal is for qualified CERT instructors to train members of neighborhoods, community organizations, or workplaces in basic response skills. CERT members are then integrated into the emergency response capability for their areas. In the event of a natural or man-made disaster, these individuals would provide assistance to their community if emergency services were delayed in response. Topics covered in CERT Training: Disaster Preparedness, Fire Suppression, Disaster Medical Operations, Light Search and Rescue, Disaster Psychology, Animals in Disaster and Terrorism Awareness.

CERT class participants must be 15 years old. Minimum class size is 12. All CERT graduates receive a certificate and a York County CERT backpack full of emergency essentials.



The team member course is 20-22 hours. CERT participants get hands-on experience through simulated disasters.

TURN AROUND DON'T DROWN®

Each year, more deaths occur due to flooding than from any other thunderstorm related hazard. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention report that over half of all flood-related drownings occur when a vehicle is driven into hazardous flood water. The next highest percentage of flood-related deaths is due to walking into or near flood waters. People underestimate the force and power of water. Many of the deaths occur in cars swept downstream. Many of these drownings are preventable. Never drive around the barriers blocking a flooded road. The road may have collapsed under that water. A mere 6 inches of fast-moving flood water can knock over an adult. It takes just 12 inches of rushing water to carry away most cars and just 2 feet of rushing water can carry away SUVs and trucks. It is NEVER safe to drive or walk into flood waters.

BACKYARD ENTERTAINING

Entertaining in our backyards is continuing to be a popular trend, and gas and charcoal grills, outdoor fryers, and firebowls and chimeneas are very popular accessories. While most open burning is prohibited in the Township (contact the Township if you have any questions regarding open burning), these accessories may be used if the proper precautions and manufacturer instructions are strictly followed. Please feel free to contact the Township if you have any questions regarding the use of these types of backyard accessories.



DOOR TO DOOR SALES

(TRANSIENT BUSINESSES)

Any person desiring to engage in a door to door (transient) retail business in York Township must first apply to the Township for a license. If you receive a knock at your door and the person standing on your porch is attempting to solicit your business to purchase goods or services, please first ask to see their Permit for Soliciting & Peddling. The permit is a 2" x 3.5" yellow card with "Permit For Soliciting & Peddling" at the top along with a specific imprinted permit number and expiration date. If they do not have a valid permit card to show you, they may not solicit in the Township and are in violation of the Township ordinances. The Township shares the applicant's information with the police department so that the police are aware of who is knocking on your door, therefore, please call 911 immediately to report a salesperson who does not have a proper permit or if a salesperson left you feeling pressured and uneasy.

- **13.** Primrose Lane from Heather Drive to second intersection with Chestnut Run
- 14. Chestnut Run from Primrose Lane to Primrose Lane

OBSTRUCTIONS THAT OVERHANG THE ROAD

Please be aware that as property owners in York Township, you are responsible to keep your property clear from any obstructions that overhang the edge of the road.

Examples include but are not limited to: tree limbs, shrubbery, hedges, grassy areas, mailboxes, fencing, etc.

Many activities occur close to the curb with large vehicles that can be impacted when these obstructions exist.

Examples include snow and ice removal, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, school bus travel, etc.

Overgrown tree limbs and vegetation also impact the sight distance for the motoring public which can be a safety concern. Refer to Ordinance # 2014-5 found on the website for specific requirements.





2019 DALLASTOWN AREA HIGH SCHOOL SCIENCE & ENGINEERING FAIR WINNERS

York Township congratulates the 2019 York Township Science & Engineering Fair scholarship winners. York Township provides scholarships for the best junior and senior "Water Quality or Stormwater Management Project" as part of our stormwater management program.







The junior project winner selected was "Oxygen vs Eutrophication: The Effects of Aeration on Water Quality," by **Aniruth Ramanathan.**

The purpose of Aniruth's experiment was to determine whether or not the purification properties of the air diffusion aeration method would have the same effect on nitrogen and phosphorus compounds that it has on other unwanted compounds such as carbon dioxide (CO²), and prevent decreases

in water quality and the formation of harmful algal blooms that result from excessive amounts of nitrogen and phosphorus by increasing the percentage of oxygen in a eutrophic water source.

York Township would also like to congratulate all of the 2019 Dallastown Area High School Science & Engineering Fair winners: Senior High Grand Champion Ibnat Meah, Senior High Reserve Grand Champion Astha Ray, Junior High Grand Champion Robert Nicholson, and Junior High Reserve Grand Champion Catharine Lasher.

DEP REMINDS POOL OWNERS TO HANDLE WASTE WATER RESPONSIBLY

In an effort to help protect stream health and aquatic life, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) would like to remind private and public pool owners, as well as pool management companies, how to properly close their swimming pools for the season.

Discharged pool water and waters containing chlorine or other chemicals can be detrimental to aquatic life if not handled responsibly. It is extremely important that these waters are handled correctly. Pool waters must not be discharged to any storm sewer or land in which a storm sewer is accessible. Runoff can cause fish kills and unsafe aquatic conditions.

"Pool owners and professional pool cleaners need to dispose of old water appropriately and conscientiously," said Acting DEP Secretary Patrick McDonnell. "Most of all, we need to make sure the wastewater is going into the sanitary sewer, where it may be allowed – and not into our storm sewers where it can harm aquatic life."

When draining a swimming pool this year, make sure to protect Pennsylvania by following these tips:

- Pool water may be disposed of through the sanitary sewer system.
- Never dispose of pool water through a storm sewer, which will discharge to a stream.
- If lowering the water level of the pool, let it drain to a lawn to prevent it from running off into a storm sewer.
- If a sanitary sewer system is not available, water may be used for irrigation if it does not run off the property or into a storm sewer.



The discharge of swimming pool water to any waters of the Commonwealth without a permit is a violation of the Clean Streams Law. Property owners and pool companies that violate this law may be prosecuted and penalized for damages.

FIFI AND FIDO SAY "PICK IT UP"!

For as long as Fifi and Fido have been our best friends, pet waste has posed a menace to our noses and feet. Now science has revealed a more unsavory truth: It's an environmental pollutant. In the mid-1990s, scientists perfected methods for tracking the origin of nasty bacteria in streams and seawater. From Clearwater, Fla., to Arlington, Va., to York, Pa., the trail

has led straight to Fifi and Fido — and to owners who don't pick up after their pets. Municipalities, including York Township, can issue citations to those who ignore pet clean-up ordinances.

Although many dog lovers are in denial about their pooches' leavings, researchers have named the idea that areas used by dogs pump more bacteria into waterways — the "Fido hypothesis." Dogs generate disease-causing bacteria that can make people sick. These include *E. coli*, a bacterium that can cause disease, and fecal coliform bacteria, which spread through feces. Dogs also carry salmonella and giardia.

Studies done in the last few years put dogs third or fourth on the list of contributors to bacteria in contaminated waters. However, several studies have found that roughly 40% of Americans don't pick up after their dogs. Picking up after your dogs is one of the easiest things you can do to help clean up York Township streams and the Chesapeake Bay.

Reasons for picking up:

- It's the law
- Environmentally friendly
- Hygiene/health reasons

Keep the yard clean – Everyone benefits if you do your part and "scoop the poop"

- Neighborhood courtesy
- It should be done



Please note that York Township also has Park Rules in reference to canine solid waste AND leashing of canines at Township Parks. Park Rule #12:

DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON A LEASH OR OTHERWISE TIED. ALL CANINE SOLID WASTE MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE PARKS.

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLINGCAN BE INCLUDED:

<u>Metal</u> – aluminum beverage cans, steel food and beverage cans, empty aerosol cans, empty paint cans

Glass – clear, brown, and green glass food and beverage containers
Plastics – bottles and jugs #1, #2, & #5, neck narrower than the
sides of the bottle

<u>Newspaper</u> – clean and dry, no food contact <u>Cardboard</u> – dry and flattened, no food contact <u>Cartons</u> – milk, juice, soup, wine, broth, cream, egg substitutes

CANNOT BE INCLUDED:

<u>Soiled Materials</u> – dirty diapers, wet cardboard, food waste, food-soiled materials, used paper towels or tissues

<u>Hazardous Materials & Medical Waste</u> – all solvent, oil, chemical containers, propane tanks, pool chemicals, *batteries, and NEEDLES

Electronic Waste

<u>Packing Materials</u> – styrofoam, packing peanuts, shredded paper, and bubble wrap

<u>Lights & Glassware</u> – light bulbs, strings of lights, drinking glasses, broken glass and mirrors

<u>Paper & Paperboard</u> – newspaper inserts, magazines, catalogs/ brochures, envelopes, mail, food boxes, pizza boxes, paper towel & toilet paper rolls, office paper, tissue boxes, phone books, and other soft cover books

- * Household (alkaline) batteries can be placed in the trash. Rechargeable batteries can be recycled at select retailers.
- ** Plastic bags should be recycled at grocery stores and department stores, including Walmart, Target, etc.

COMMERCIAL RECYCLING IS REQUIRED BY LAW

Pennsylvania State Act 101 of 1988 and York Township Ordinance 2006-12 require nonresidential establishments to recycle. Nonresidential establishments include all commercial, municipal, institutional, and community groups that do not fit into a residential category. To comply with the State and Local laws, you are required to recycle the following items:

- Aluminum
- Steel and bimetallic cans
- High-Grade Office Paper
- Leaf waste
- Corrugated Paper (cardboard)
- · Glass (clear, brown and green)

NATIONWIDE RECYCLING CRISIS

Unfortunately, due to the "hopeful recycling" many citizens have done in the past, our recyclables have been contaminated with items that DO NOT belong in the recycling stream (garden hoses, scrap metal, plastic toys, disposable diapers). The excessive contamination has caused China, the world's largest consumer of recycled materials, to reject most recyclables from the United States. New recycling guidelines have been set forth to encourage residents "back to the basics" in order to clean up the recycling stream. The two major changes are:

- 1) Plastics #1, #2, & #5 only, bottles & jugs, narrower neck than the sides of the bottle
- Newspaper/Cardboard clean, dry and flattened newspaper and cardboard only, NO food contact

Cans, glass and cartons are still acceptable items for recycling. All items should be clean, caps removed.

Please help our recycling center achieve a clean and pure recycling stream that can be marketed and eventually used to produce new items.

RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) item shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight in the evening when collection occurs.

Important guidelines to keep in mind for residential trash collection services are as follows:

On April 10, 2018 the York Township Board of Commissioners awarded the residential trash collection contract to Penn Waste for the next four years. The quarterly fees for basic service of (3) 32-gallon bags or cans of trash, unlimited recycling with cart, one large item per week, 12 times per year curbside yard waste collection and a Township administration fee of \$1.50 are as follows:

July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019 = \$48.00 per quarter July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 = \$49.38 per quarter July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021 = \$50.82 per quarter July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022 = \$52.35 per quarter

The optional 96-gallon mobile trash cart rental fee will be:

July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019 = \$11.50 per quarter July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 = \$11.80 per quarter July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021 = \$12.20 per quarter July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022 = \$12.55 per quarter

The price for extra service bags will remain at \$4.00 each from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2020 and will increase to \$4.50 for July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2022.

Large (Bulk) Items: If your waste collection falls under the Township residential contract (directly billed by Penn Waste), you are entitled to place one large (bulk) item out per week with your regular trash and recycling. You only need to contact Penn Waste in advance if the item contains refrigerant (i.e. refrigerator, dehumidifier, air conditioner). Bulk items are those that cannot be disposed in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people (i.e. sofa, mattress, carpet, etc.). Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their rent or condo/homeowners fee must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.

Round Recycling Bins: Are the property of York Township, not the contracted hauler. The bins should remain with the property if sold. The bins are partially funded through a State recycling grant. If you never received a 32-gallon bin and you are billed directly by Penn Waste, you may pick one up at the Township offices. If your bin is cracked or broken, you must bring it to the Township office to obtain another bin. Additional bins may be purchased for a fee of \$7.50. Recycling bin stickers are available free-of-charge for those who wish to provide their own smaller bin for recycling.

If you are not directly billed by Penn Waste and your refuse service is provided through your landlord, condo association, or homeowner's association, you must contact the landlord or association to get a recycling bin through your refuse hauler.

Recyclables must be placed in a separate bin from trash and are picked up on your regular trash day. Replacement bins are available at the Township Administrative Office or the Public Works Department.

RESIDENTIAL BRUSH DROP OFF

Residential Brush is defined as tree limbs, shrubbery leaves and the like (no grass) no larger than 8 inches in diameter by 6 feet in length. York Township accepts brush from Township residents as part of our recycling efforts.

The drop off site is located at the Township Municipal Building beyond the open gate to the designated pile, between the two signs, on the left. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road, for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

Remember to make sure that all brush is secured to your vehicle when hauling loads to the drop off site.

The site will be open for self-serve (unassisted) drop-off from dawn to dusk (during daylight hours only). Do not drive past the gate at any other time other than the dates listed below:

- FRIDAY, MAY 3 MONDAY, MAY 20
- FRIDAY, JUNE 7 MONDAY, JUNE 24
- WEDNESDAY, JULY 3 MONDAY, JULY 22
- FRIDAY, AUGUST 2 MONDAY, AUGUST 19
- FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 6 MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 23
- FRIDAY, OCTOBER 4 MONDAY, OCTOBER 21
- FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 1 MONDAY, NOVEMBER 18
- FRIDAY, DECEMBER 6 MONDAY, DECEMBER 9

We ask that you participate in this program responsibly by not dumping unlawful items at the site. Examples are garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings, etc. We do accept commercial landscaping residue such as tree roots, large tree removal projects and the like.

All other material and items you see beyond the gate are the property of the Township and not for use of the general public.



Do not touch or take anything while in this restricted area. If you see a violation, please report it to the Township or York Area Regional Police Department. **Please be aware that the site is under constant video surveillance.**

All brush received will be chipped into mulch and will be made available to Township residents free of charge. The mulch pile is located in front of the gate (left side). Mulch may not be available at all times. The mulch availability and the times and dates of brush recycling are subject to change at Township discretion.

CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Please follow these guidelines when placing yard waste for collection: Place curbside by **6:00 am** on the designated Saturdays. The hauler starts promptly at 6:00 am and quickly moves through the township as they do not need to stop at every residence.

Yard waste includes material such as tree trimmings, shrubbery and other organic landscape vegetation no larger than 8" in diameter. Yard waste DOES NOT include: grass clippings, weeds, fruit and vegetable scraps, tree stumps, dirt and stones, or any trash or recyclable materials.

Prepare for collection: Place yard waste in biodegradable brown craft bags or bundle with biodegradable twine in bundles no longer than 4 feet in length, not weighing more than 50 pounds. You may also use the round blue 32 gallon recycle bins or similar 32 gallon can without a lid. The yard waste must be visible to the hauler.

Yard waste in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected on the designated Saturday yard waste collection days.

YARD/WOODY WASTE

Township residents are encouraged to recycle their yard/ woody waste by either the curbside collection or at the Township drop off facility. Material such as tree and shrubbery trimmings and other organic landscape vegetation no larger than 8" in diameter is accepted. In no instance should anything other than the aforementioned items be placed in the brown Kraft bags for collection or drop off. **NO grass, weeds, dirt, stones, fruit & vegetable scraps, trash or recyclables are acceptable.** The Township has been experiencing some of these items "hidden" in the bottom of the Kraft bags which causes damage to the equipment used to process the yard/woody waste into mulch.

WASTE OIL DISPOSAL

Waste oil (motor, cooking or transmission) may be dropped off at the Public Works Service Building Monday – Friday from 7:30 am – 3:00 pm. You may enter the lower restricted area for this purpose. Drop the product off at the end of the Service Building (smaller of the two buildings) at the designated area identified by a sign. Do not drop off products after hours. We do not accept gasoline or engine coolant (anti-freeze). Please be aware that the site is under constant video surveillance.








811 - PA ONE CALL

Safe Digging: If you plan to dig for any reason, you must call 811 at least three days before digging to get your underground utilities marked.

The national "Call Before You Dig" number, 811, connects homeowners and contractors with the Pennsylvania One Call System. This organization informs utility companies of a homeowner's intent to dig and provides the opportunity for utility companies to mark buried pipes and cables before digging commences, protecting both the utility lines and homeowners.

No matter how large or small the project is, it's important to know what's below. Call 811 if you are installing a fence or deck, or digging for a mailbox post, patio, or other excavation project. Calling 811 can prevent a potentially dangerous situation, as well as saving homeowners and contractors potentially costly repair bills.

This service is free for homeowners, and it's the law. The 811 "Call Before You Dig" hotline operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year.

Sewer Line Safety: Additionally, it is important that you or your plumber call 811 prior to clearing a blocked sewer line.

Sewer lines are sometimes not marked or incorrectly marked, leaving the potential for natural gas lines to be installed through sewer lines. If a sewer backup develops, a plumber or homeowner often attempts to clear the blockage by using a mechanical rotary device. This can damage the utility line and create an unsafe situation allowing natural gas to migrate into homes and buildings.

Before you or your plumber attempt to clear a blocked sewer line, call 811 to have your sewer and gas lines located and inspected.
