

FROM THE MANAGER'S DESK

Updates on various projects and Township news from February 2020 to May 2020

The Board approved Ordinance 2019-2 Amending the maximum speed limit for Chestnut Hill Road between Springwood Road and Camp Betty Washington Road to 30 mph.

The Board appointed Dave Koratich as alternate to the Planning Commission for a term expiring on October 31, 2023.

The Board approved, with conditions, various waiver requests for U.S. Renal Care Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan, located at 2721 South Queen Street.

STORMWATER NEWS

MELTING SNOW: IT'S STORMWATER TOO! (ADAPTATION FROM THE PENN STATE EXTENSION)

When snow melts at your home, it can create problems that are similar to spring rains but unique to winter weather. Winter snow often puts a pristine white coat over every surface that makes for beautiful photos and lots of family fun. However, it's not long before the sun comes out to expose a host of issues created by the melting snow. Just like when rain falls the rest of the year, melting snow turns into stormwater runoff. Heavy rains sweeping across your yard and driveway carry pollution and high volumes of water into our nearby streams, lakes, and other waterways.



Melting snow does the same things. Both rain and snow melt can seriously impair Pennsylvania's waters when they travel over the land in our developed communities. They can also cause significant property damage at your home.


In winter, melting snow actually causes a few unique stormwater problems. Because the ground is often frozen at the surface, melting snow can't infiltrate into the soil the way a light or moderate rain would be able to. So even a small amount of snow can cause localized flooding on your property. When snow builds up over several small storm events without melting in between, it can have the impact of a large winter storm when it finally does melt – leading to potential community wide flooding events. In both cases, that standing and flowing water on the ground is picking up all kinds of debris, pollutants (especially decicing salts and chemicals), and litter that will find their way into nearby streams.


Here are some tips for managing your property for winter stormwater this season:



When piling your snow after shoveling and plowing, choose locations where the snow will have the most opportunity to infiltrate instead of becoming stormwater runoff. Pile your snow in areas where you don't usually

have ponding in the spring rains, on relatively flat areas, and away from sensitive areas like streams, ponds, and your private well if you have one.





Use de-icing chemicals and salts judiciously. Use what you need to make your walkways and driveways safe, but try to avoid spreading around sensitive areas like waterways and your private well.

Postpone outdoor construction projects in winter, when you can't establish new vegetation to reduce soil loss and muddy runoff.

Following these best management practices will help prevent degradation of water quality in York Township's waterways, so please do your part to protect our streams from unnecessary stormwater pollution!

FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR'S DESK

I wish everyone a Happy & Healthy New Year!

The 2020 County/Township Tax Bill will be mailed out on 2/14/20. The discount date for the tax bills will be 4/15/20. Please let me know if you haven't received your County/Township Tax Bill. If you have moved and want your tax bills sent to your new address or if you spend your February in a warmer climate and want your taxes sent to that address, let me know and I can email your tax bill.

If you have delinquent taxes from prior years, you will need to contact the York County Tax Claim Bureau for payment of those taxes. The York County Tax Claim Bureau's phone number is 717-771-9205.

Please contact the office before coming in to get copies of the previous year taxes. I can e-mail these copies to you or your Tax Preparer. If you are 65 years or older, or over 50 and a widow/widower, or you are 18 and older, permanently disabled and on SSI, you may qualify for the Property Tax or a Rent Rebate from Pennsylvania. Ask your Tax Preparer, if you go to one, for information. The general purpose tax rate and fire tax rate for 2020 will remain the same as 2019 at 1.24 mills and 0.37 mills. YORK TOWNSHIP WINTER MAINTENANCE OVERVIEW

WINTER MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

All Township roads are divided into 18 sections or routes. An operator, with pre-determined equipment, is assigned to one of these 18 routes. The majority of the time this is the standard deployment, however depending on the conditions, we may only deploy 6 operators to treat the snow emergency roads or what is designated as the priority routes. Snow emergency roads are posted

with signs and are designated as such due to factors of high traffic volume, steep grades, and areas with limited access or close proximity to the Schools, Police, Fire and Medical Facilities.



Prior to the storm, you may notice the pretreating of certain priority roads with liquid brine. The brine is a specific concentration (23.3 %) of sodium chloride that lowers the freezing point of water. Although we would like to pretreat all of the Township roads, it's just not possible due to time and equipment availability. When appropriate, we plan to pretreat all of the snow emergency routes with liquid brine.

SNOW EMERGENCIES

On rare occasions, a snow emergency will be declared. The initial focus will be on the priority (snow emergency posted) roads. The snow emergency declaration will be broadcast on the local radio and television stations and will be posted on the York Township website. Again, all snow emergency streets are identified with signage.

After the snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful at any time during the continuance of the emergency for any person.

- 1. To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency routes designated; or
- 2. To operate a motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route in such a manner or in such a reasonable condition as to allow or permit such vehicle to become stalled on such route, either by reason of the fact that the driving wheels of such vehicle are not equipped with tire chains or effective tires or by reason of the fact that the motor fuel supply of such vehicle has been allowed to become exhausted.

Please be aware that failure to abide by the above is a violation of a Township ordinance and may result in fines and/or towing costs. For a complete listing of the streets and a full text of the ordinance, please visit the Township website.

STATE ROADS

Many roads within York Township are owned and maintained by PennDOT. State roads include: Interstate 83, Cape Horn Road/Winterstown Road, South Queen Street, East Prospect Road, Leaders Height Road/Indian Rock Dam Road, South Pleasant Avenue (from Dallastown Boro to Hess Farm Road), Springwood Road, Camp Betty Washington Road, Lombard Road - Yoe, Country Club Road, Hess Farm Road (Township line to Iron Stone Hill and South Pleasant to Township line), South Duke Street - Dallastown, Horn Road/South Franklin Street (from South Duke to Horn Road), South Park Street, Iron Stone Hill Road, South George Street/Susquehanna Trail, Starcross Road/Old Baltimore Pike, Reynolds Mill Road, Brillhart Station Road, Hollywood Drive, Days Mill Road/ Croll School, Tyler Run Road, Waters Street (off Reynolds Mill Road) and Grantley Road. PennDOT has their own policies and procedures for winter maintenance. Please contact the local PennDOT maintenance office at 717-848-6230 for assistance.

MAILBOXES AND DRIVEWAYS

York Township DOES NOT compensate property owners should their mailbox, or any other object, become damaged due to the removal of snow from Township roads. Any object placed in the road right-of-way, including a mailbox, fence, landscaping, etc., is at the

owner's risk. The public right of way is on average 50 feet wide (25 feet from the center of the roadway). Mailbox damage usually happens from the weight of the snow. Make sure your mailbox is sturdy and secure prior to winter.

It is suggested that you wait until after all plowing is complete before shoveling out the end of your driveway. If you



do shovel out before the plows have come through, try to clear a spot upstream of your driveway. This will allow the snow from the plow to unload before the driveway. It won't prevent all snow from going back in front of your driveway but it will reduce the amount. The snow must be plowed from the street, therefore all driveways and properties will be affected to some degree.

STREET CLEANING

Street cleaning usually begins after winter maintenance completely ends. It is a continuous process that does not stop until all streets have been cleaned. York Township is not responsible for state roads, therefore the Township will not clean or maintain them.

JUST A REMINDER

Just a friendly reminder to the property owners in York Township. It is your responsibility to keep your trees, shrubbery, mailboxes, etc. from protruding past the curb into the street area. There are many maintenance activities that must occur close to the curb (snow plowing, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, etc.) which can be impacted by these obstructions. Overgrown trees and shrubbery can also impact the sight distance for the motoring public. Refer to Ordinance # 2014-5 found on the Township website for more details.

EMERGENCIES

If you observe what would appear to be an emergency with sanitary sewers, roadways or storm water facilities, please call the Public Works Department from 7:00 am to 3:30 pm Monday through Friday at 717-741-3861 x170. After these hours, or on weekends & holidays, dial 911.

PLANNING FOR EMERGENCIES

How can we prepare for the most common emergency situations that might occur in our day to day lives? We are fortunate that most common emergency situations are only inconveniences in our lives, but sometimes emergencies can threaten our property and well-being. In emergency management, the biggest threats are classified as high risk, low frequency. What kinds of emergencies are these? Hurricanes (here in PA), terrorist events, workplace violence, big earthquakes, etc. These are the events that emergency planners at federal, state, county, and even municipal EMAs try to plan for. You may have heard or even participated at nuclear plant drills for our 2 nuclear power stations in/near York County. Drills are one way that emergency planners test their EOPs, or Emergency Operation Plans. They can find out where the weaknesses exist in their plans.

On a personal level, we can have emergency plans too. Usually, this is something informal, just a "what if" thing we do in our heads when we hear of others who face emergency situations. What if we lost power for 2 days in the middle of summer? What if we became stranded on the turnpike in the middle of winter? Some simple planning and preparation can make the difference between being miserable, or simply inconvenienced. In rare cases, not being prepared can have more significant consequences.

Being prepared consists of 2 major steps:

- 1. Making a plan. American Red Cross offers these suggestions on making a personal emergency plan:
 - Plan for the emergencies that are most likely to happen where you live
 - Be familiar with natural disaster risks in your community.
 - · Consider how you will respond to emergencies that can happen anywhere, such as home fires and floods.
 - Think about emergencies that may require your family to shelter in place (such as a winter storm), vs. emergencies that may require evacuation (such as a hurricane).

2. Assemble some items. Your summer car emergency kit will be different from your winter car kit. Your shelter in place home kit will be different from your evacuation kit ("go bag"). In upcoming newsletters, we will look at different items to add to different kits. For this issue, we offer a suggestion for a shelter in place home kit (3-day emergency). Start with what you have. Don't include what you know (FOR SURE) that you won't need. Add things that are personal to you that you will need. It's completely adaptable to your personal situation. Some companies sell kits. We think you can assemble your own kit more economically, and one that will be more useful to YOU.

3-DAY EMERGENCY SHELTER-IN-PLACE KIT


- Water + water purifier (such as Life Straws or Potable Aqua) (bottled water, aim for 1 gal/person/ day)
- Waste disposal (5-6 gallon storage container can be used for toilet flushing -- or stash some contractor's heavy trash bags/5-gal bucket for waste disposal if flushing is not possible; some facilities keep cat litter and small trash bags for emergency waste disposal)
- Food (non-perishable: canned items, or multi-day, multi-person kits that have up to 10-year shelf life)
- Lighting (flashlights + battery operated lanterns; LED bulbs are most power efficient; candles are not recommended)
- Whistle
- Dust masks
- Chargers (for phones, include cables + charged power packs)

- Basic first aid supplies
- Meds/tests (such as blood sugar testing) supplies
- Extra clothing
- Blankets for winter, battery operated fan for summer
- Crank emergency radio (bonus points for NOAA weather crank-powered radios)
- Baby food, formula and supplies (diapers, wipes, powder/lotion)
- Antibacterial handwipes for sanitation
- Pet food/meds

ORDINANCE REVIEW – CHAPTER 199: SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL

Please keep the following requirements in mind when clearing snow and ice from public sidewalks and/or near fire hydrants on your property this winter:

Every person in charge or control of any building or lot of land fronting or abutting on a paved sidewalk, whether as owner, tenant, occupant, lessee or otherwise, shall remove and clear away or cause to be removed or cleared away snow and/or ice from a path of at least 30 inches in width from so much of said sidewalk as is in front of or abuts on said building or lot of land.

- A. Except as provided in Subsection B hereof, snow and ice shall be removed from sidewalks within 12 hours after the cessation of any fall of snow, sleet or freezing rain.
- B. In the event that snow and/or ice on a sidewalk has become so hard that it cannot be removed without likelihood of damage to the sidewalk, the person charged with its removal shall, within the time mentioned in Subsection A hereof, cause enough sand or other abrasive to be put on the sidewalk to make travel reasonably safe and shall, as soon thereafter as weather permits, cause to be cleared a path in said sidewalk of at least 30 inches in width.

No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any snow or ice on or immediately next to a fire hydrant or on any sidewalk, roadway or loading and unloading areas of a public transportation system.

BUILDING PERMITS AND THE UCC

In accordance with Pennsylvania law, York Township adopted the Uniform Construction Code (UCC), commonly referred to as "the building code." All construction work that falls under the UCC requires building plan review to ensure compliance with the Code. Working with a contractor who is knowledgeable of the current Code will help to avoid delays during review of required construction documents, during required inspections and possibly avoid additional cost to the homeowner.

RECYCLING & TRASH INFO



BRUSH RECYCLING

Brush is defined as tree limbs, shrubbery, leaves and the like (no grass) no larger than 8 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length. York Township accepts brush from York Township residents only as part of our recycling efforts. Brush recycling is intended to clean up small amounts of debris from residential properties. The program is not intended to accept large tree removal projects. Large projects, such as removing entire trees, should employ the services of a commercial contractor. If you have large amounts of material to dispose, please contact York Township first for approval.

In addition, we suspect non-Township residents are illegally dropping brush at the Township site. In response to this, we may require proof of residency or begin to limit the disposal open times.

The drop-off site is located at the Township Building beyond the gate between the two signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

The site will be open for self-serve (unassisted) use for 4 consecutive days in the months of December, January and February. It starts the first full weekend of the month beginning on the first Friday and closing on the following Monday. Daily hours are dawn to dusk. See specific date below.

January 3, 2020 through January 6, 2020 February 7, 2020 through February 10, 2020 December 4, 2020 through December 7, 2020

During the months of March through November, the drop-off site will be open for self-serve (unassisted) for 18 consecutive days beginning on the first Friday of the month and closing three Mondays later. Daily hours are dawn to dusk. See specific dates below.

• March 6–23 • June 5–22

• April 3–20 • July 3–20

July 3-20

• May 1–18 • August 7–24

September 4–21

October 2–19

• November 6-23

We ask that you participate in this program responsibly by not dumping unlawful items at the site. Examples are garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings, etc.

All other material and items you see beyond the gate are for Township use only and are not meant for the general public to use or take. If you see a violation, please report it to the Township or York Area Regional Police Department. The site is under constant video surveillance.

Public Works will process the brush into mulch that will be made available to Township residents currently free of charge and on a first come first serve basis. The mulch pile is located in front of the gate (left side). EVEN THOUGH THE GATE MAY BE OPEN, DO NOT DRIVE PAST THE GATE WHEN THE SITE IS CLOSED, AS INDICATED BY THE RED SIGN ON THE LEFT GATE AND THE ELECTRONIC SIGN BOARD. Mulch may not be available at all times. Mulch availability and the times and dates of brush recycling is subject to change at Township discretion.

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING CAN BE INCLUDED:

<u>Metal</u> – aluminum beverage cans, steel food and beverage cans, empty aerosol cans, empty paint cans

<u>Glass</u> – clear, brown, and green glass food and beverage containers <u>Plastics</u> – bottles and jugs #1, #2, & #5, neck narrower than the

<u>Plastics</u> – bottles and jugs #1, #2, & #5, neck narrower than th sides of the bottle

Newspaper – clean and dry, no food contact

<u>Cardboard</u> – dry and flattened, no food contact

<u>Cartons</u> – milk, juice, soup, wine, broth, cream, egg substitutes

CANNOT BE INCLUDED:

<u>Soiled Materials</u> – dirty diapers, wet cardboard, food waste, food-soiled materials, used paper towels or tissues

<u>Hazardous Materials & Medical Waste</u> – all solvent, oil, chemical containers, propane tanks, pool chemicals, *batteries, and NEEDLES <u>Electronic Waste</u> – computers, computer accessories, televisions, monitors, and e-readers

<u>**Packing Materials**</u> – styrofoam, packing peanuts, shredded paper, and bubble wrap

<u>Lights & Glassware</u> – light bulbs, strings of lights, drinking glasses, broken glass and mirrors

<u>Paper & Paperboard</u> – newspaper inserts, magazines, catalogs/ brochures, envelopes & junk mail, food boxes (i.e. cereal & Jello), pizza boxes, paper towel & toilet paper rolls, office paper (any color), tissue boxes, phone books, and other soft cover books

- * Household (alkaline) batteries can be placed in the trash. Rechargeable batteries can be recycled at select retailers.
- ** Plastic bags should be recycled at grocery stores and department stores, including Walmart, Target, etc.

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents ONLY and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to noon at the Small Load Drop-off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406.

NATIONWIDE RECYCLING CRISIS

Unfortunately, due to the "hopeful recycling" many citizens have done in the past, our recyclables have been contaminated with items that DO NOT belong in the recycling stream (garden hoses, scrap metal, plastic toys, disposable diapers). The excessive contamination has caused China, the world's largest consumer of recycled materials, to reject most recyclables from the United States. New recycling guidelines have been set forth to encourage residents "back to the basics" in order to clean up the recycling stream. The two major changes are:

- **1) Plastics** #1, #2, & #5 only, bottles & jugs, narrower neck than the sides of the bottle
- 2) Newspaper/Cardboard clean, dry and flattened newspaper and cardboard only, NO food contact Cans, glass and cartons are still acceptable items for recycling. All items should be clean, caps removed.

Please help our recycling center achieve a clean and pure recycling stream that can be marketed and eventually used to produce new items. "When in doubt – throw it out!"

COMMERCIAL RECYCLING IS REQUIRED BY LAW

Pennsylvania State Act 101 of 1988 and York Township Ordinance 2006-12 require nonresidential establishments to recycle. Nonresidential establishments include all commercial, municipal, institutional, and community groups that do not fit into a residential category. To comply with the State and Local laws, you are required to recycle the following items:

- Aluminum
- · Steel and bimetallic cans
- High-Grade Office Paper
- Leaf waste
- Corrugated Paper (cardboard)
- Glass (clear, brown and green)



RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) items shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight in the evening when collection occurs.

Important guidelines to keep in mind for residential trash collection services are as follows:

On April 10, 2018 the York Township Board of Commissioners awarded the residential trash collection contract to Penn Waste for the next four years. The quarterly fees for basic service of (3) 32-gallon bags or cans of trash, unlimited recycling with cart, one large item per week, 12 times per year curbside yard waste collection and a Township administration fee of \$1.50. For the first time since 2017, York County Solid Waste Authority must increase the cost of disposal of solid waste beginning January 1, 2020 from \$62 per ton to \$65 per ton. This tipping fee equates to a 77¢ increase per quarter per household added to the Penn Waste costs allowed under the current residential contract. Please note the new rates as follows:

January 1, 2020 – June 30, 2020 = \$50.15 per quarter July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021 = \$51.59 per quarter

July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022 = \$53.12 per quarter The optional 96-gallon mobile trash cart rental fee will be:

July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 = \$11.80 per quarter

July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021 = \$12.20 per quarter July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022 = \$12.55 per quarter

The price for extra service bags will remain at \$4.00 each from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 and will increase to \$4.50 for July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2022.

Large (Bulk) Items: If your waste collection falls under the Township residential contract (directly billed by Penn Waste), you are entitled to place one large (bulk) item out per week with your regular trash and recycling. You only need to contact Penn Waste in advance if the item contains refrigerant (i.e. refrigerator, dehumidifier, air conditioner). Bulk items are those which cannot be disposed in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people (i.e. sofa, mattress, carpet, etc.) Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their rent or condo/homeowners fee must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.

Round Recycling Bins: Are the property of York Township, not the contracted hauler. The bins should remain with the property if sold. The bins are partially funded through a State recycling grant. If you never received a 32-gallon bin and you are billed directly by Penn Waste, you may pick one up at the Township offices. If your bin is cracked or broken, you must bring it to the Township office to obtain another bin. Additional bins may be purchased for a fee of \$7.50. Recycling bin stickers are available free-of-charge for those who wish to provide their own smaller bin for recycling.

If you are not directly billed by Penn Waste and your refuse service is provided through your landlord, condo association, or homeowner's association, you must contact the landlord or association to get a recycling bin through your refuse hauler.

Recyclables must be placed in a separate bin from trash and are picked up on your regular trash day. Replacement bins are available at the Township Administrative Office or the Public Works Department.



RECYCLING & TRASH INFO



YARD/WOODY WASTE

Township residents are encouraged to recycle their yard/woody waste by either the curbside collection or at the Township drop-off facility. Material such as tree and shrubbery trimmings and other organic landscape vegetation no larger than 8" in diameter is accepted. In no instance should anything other than the aforementioned items be placed in the brown kraft bags for collection or drop off. **NO grass, weeds, dirt, stones, fruit & vegetable scraps, trash or recyclables are acceptable.** The Township has been experiencing some of these items "hidden" in the bottom of the kraft bags which causes damage to the equipment used to process the yard/woody waste into mulch.

CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Please follow these guidelines when placing yard waste for collection: Place curbside by **6:00 am** on the designated Saturdays. The hauler starts promptly at 6:00 am and quickly moves through the township as they do not need to stop at every residence.

Yard waste includes material such as tree trimmings, shrubbery and other organic landscape vegetation no larger than 8" in diameter. Yard waste DOES NOT include: grass clippings, weeds, fruit and vegetable scraps, tree stumps, dirt and stones, or any trash or recyclable materials.

Prepare for collection: Place yard waste in biodegradable brown kraft bags or bundle with biodegradable twine in bundles no longer than 4 feet in length, not weighing more than 50 pounds. You may also use the round blue 32 gallon recycle bins or similar 32 gallon can without a lid. The yard waste must be visible to the hauler.

Yard waste in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected on the designated Saturday yard waste collection days.

CURBSIDE DATES:

• March 28 • April 11 • April 25 • May 23

CART PLACEMENT IS IMPORTANT!

With the new single operator vehicles (SOV) now being utilized in the Penn Waste collection fleet, it is important to properly place trash and recycling carts curbside to reduce employee injuries and property damage. Carts should be a minimum of **3 feet** from all other objects, including mailbox posts, and from each other. Please place the cart with the lid opening and pick-up bar facing the curb.

Please place cart at curb with lid opening toward street. Keep cart three feet from all objects and clear from overhead hazards such as trees and power lines.





TANGLERS

Many people try to recycle items that cannot be recycled or processed by the equipment we use at our recycling facility. Some common materials are what we call "tanglers."

Tanglers are non-recyclable items that get wrapped around the rolling screens that are used to help separate recyclables during the recycling process. Penn Waste team members do try to remove as many of the tanglers as possible, but some still make it through.

Some examples of tanglers are plastic shopping bags, garbage bags, hoses, clothing, rope, Christmas lights, plastic and metal strapping, towels, electrical cords, and VHS tapes.

Every day, 10 Penn Waste team members must climb into the machinery and cut off the tanglers. It takes at least 1 hour to remove the tanglers from each of the 4 screens and this required maintenance happens 4 times per day. The machinery must be shut down during this time which wastes time and money. In addition, climbing into the equipment puts our employees in harm's way.

The good news is, you can help! Please do not bag your recyclables. Also, do not place plastic bags, plastic packaging, or other non-recyclable items in your curbside recycling bin.

There's a list of acceptable items at www.pennwaste.com and here's a reminder... the only items that should be going in your curbside recycling bin are metal cans, plastic bottles and containers with numbers 1, 2 and 5 on the bottom, newspaper, glass bottles and jars, dry and flattened cardboard, and cartons.

And don't forget...all of these items should be clean and dry before placing in your recycling bin.

(formerly Yoe Ambulance Service) has been serving from Yoe Fire Company since 1972 and from Goodwill Fire Company since 2004. We serve a primary population of 40,000+ people residing in four municipalities; Yoe Borough, Dallastown Borough, Windsor Township and York Township. We provide 24-hour Advanced Life Support (ALS) ambulance service from each station. Peak-hour units are staffed from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm, weekdays, in order to enhance the level of service provided during this high demand period.

York Regional Emergency Medical Services Inc. is a non-profit, 501(c)3, charitable organization incorporated in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. We are licensed by the Pennsylvania Department of Health and are dispatched by the York County Department of Emergency Services – 911 Center.

The 2020 Annual Subscription requests will be mailed in March. While many Subscriptions expire at different times during the year, the bulk of our Subscribers are on an annual cycle for each Spring. Any portion of the fees not covered by private insurance, becomes an out-of-pocket expense for the patient.

As a York Regional EMS Subscriber, we will only bill Primary and Secondary Insurance providers. Payment from a subscriber's insurance carrier will satisfy your obligation to us for our service costs*. Non-Subscribers are responsible for payment in full for services, regardless of the amount covered by their insurance carrier. Subscribers shall forward any payments received directly from their insurance carrier to York Regional EMS immediately upon receipt.

The demand for emergency medical services has grown dramatically over the past several years. If we are already committed to an emergency when you need us, the 911 center will dispatch the next closest available ambulance service. YORK AREA REGIONAL is utilizing CRIMEWATCH to assist the department and communities in information sharing, crime prevention and crime mapping.

Our website, www.yapd.org, has undergone a transition and enhancement to accommodate the CRIMEWATCH Technologies, Inc. platform.

CRIMEWATCH is accessible through our website, and their app can be downloaded to your Android or iOS device. The CRIMEWATCH program allows citizens to view crime mapping locations within their community or neighborhood. A brief synopsis of the incident is provided in the description and allows the citizens to know what is occurring in locations that are of interest to them.

CRIMEWATCH will also permit citizens to submit anonymous tips via the web application or from their mobile device. All tipsters can remain anonymous and/or confidential to the police department.

There will also be an opportunity for residents and businesses to complete a camera registry. This registry is voluntary, but allows for the police department to request permission from the homeowner or business to view video footage of criminal activity that may have occurred within that general area which assists the police officers in their investigations and arresting individuals responsible for their criminal activity.

The website will still provide all the current resources and contact information that was available previously; right-to-know requests, home/vacation checks, and citizen comments. Enhancements will include; news feed, incident blotter, emergency broadcasts, push notifications, and crime mapping.

TRAFFIC UNIT:

From June – October, 2019 the department assigned several officers to handle traffic-related citizen complaints, and high crash intersections and roadways. These officers specifically focused on aggressive driving violations that were reported or led to motor vehicle crashes. These officers made 1,652 traffic contacts that led to issuing a traffic citation 90% of the time. Speeding was the most frequently cited violation. The officers cited 54 driving under suspensions, 47 seatbelt violations, made 47 criminal arrests, and served 28 outstanding warrants.

The goal of the Traffic Unit was to address traffic-related citizen complaints and aggressive driving violations that lead to motor vehicle crashes. Success is not measured in the number of citations issued or traffic stops conducted, but the reduction of citizen complaints and crashes at those high-crash intersections and roadways.

UPCOMING PROGRAMS:

The Police Department will be hosting these events in 2020. Please look for information on our website, and Facebook page when these will be occurring. Preference for attendance will be given to the citizens we serve.

Citizen Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) -

Three (3) officers completed a train-the-trainer course to instruct this program to the public. The course(s) will be advertised to the public for participation and will prioritize the training to citizens within our jurisdiction.

Stop the Bleed – Stop the Bleed is a national awareness campaign and call to action. This program was launched in October, 2015 by the White House to encourage bystanders to become trained, equipped and empowered to assist victims in a bleeding emergency before professional help arrives.

- **REGISTRATION FORMS for various programs** will be placed online at <u>www.yorktownshiprec.com</u> as they become available. Forms for some programs may also be picked up at the YTRec Office.
- **ADVANCE PAYMENT** is required for all programs as it will ensure a space in the class/program. Checks may be made payable to York Township.
- PARTICIPATION in any class/program/event constitutes permission to use likeness in promotional materials.
- THE DEPARTMENT is NOT responsible for injuries while participating in any of its activities.
- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician will be required. No refunds for Bus Trips will be given when spots are cancelled less than 30 days before trip unless the trip is cancelled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- PROGRAM SIZE is limited and will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.
- PROGRAM DATES & TIMES are contingent on availability of facilities and are subject to change.
- **PROGRAMS** postponed or not held by the instructor due to emergencies will be made up by the instructor or fees will be prorated. Classes missed by the participant will not be made up.
- **POLICY ON CHILDREN**—Participants are not permitted to bring children with them to class. Enrollment age is included with the description of most of the classes.

PARK RULES / HOURS

- 1. ALL Parks are closed between dusk and dawn, with the exception of York Township Park. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
- 2. No littering.
- 3. No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
- 4. NO GOLFING IN PARKS. Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
- 5. Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned.
- **6.** No solicitation.
- 7. No alcoholic beverages or drugs. No one permitted in the area under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs.
- 8. Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, rifles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.
- **9.** Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
- **10.** Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
- 11. No facilities may be reserved without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
- 12. Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
- 13. Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
- 14. No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game trucks, etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.
