## FROM THE MANAGER'S DESK

Township news from February – May 2020

Dear York Township Resident,

My hope is that by the time this newsletter is published, some semblance of a normal life has returned. During this time of uncertainty, the Township's top priority is the safety and well-being of our employees, residents, and businesses.

The Township has been adhering to guidelines from the CDC and Governor's Office, and we reopened our doors to the public on May 8, 2020. Below is a summary of actions currently taken by the Township as part of our response to the coronavirus emergency.

- Township staff continues to serve the needs of our residents and businesses while not having direct contact with the public. Interactions with staff are done via telephone, e-mail, or by utilizing the outside drop boxes located at the entrance to the Township Municipal Building.
- Payments to the Township or to the Tax Collector can be made by using the outside drop boxes or in person starting May 8. If using the drop box, please pay by check or money order **only** (no cash) and place in an envelope. All envelopes must be clearly marked with your name, property address, phone number, account number and e-mail address (if applicable). If an e-mail address is provided, a receipt will be e-mailed to you.
- The Federal and State Tax filing due dates have been extended to July 15, 2020. York Township Municipal Taxes are tied to the County Tax bill and the Township will support and follow the lead set by the County. For businesses, York Township has extended the due date of the Mercantile and Business Privileges Tax to July 15, 2020.
- All sewer bills issued March 1, 2020, will not have a late fee imposed if paid by June 16, 2020. All sewer bills issued April 1 or May 1, 2020, will have a due date of June 16, 2020. The Township will not pursue water shut off for unpaid sewer bills through June 16, 2020.
- The Recreation Department is still collecting registration for upcoming programs. For information on how to submit payments and for status of future programs and events, please visit the Recreation website at [www.yorktownshiprec.com](http://www.yorktownshiprec.com) or follow YTRecreation on Facebook at <https://www.facebook.com/YTRecreation/>.
- Park trails and open spaces are open for passive activities and we strongly encourage social distancing when using them. Since playgrounds and sports courts do not follow the CDC guidelines for social distancing or social gatherings, they are temporarily closed. For now, portable toilets have replaced the public bathroom facilities. Use hand sanitizer after using these facilities.
- The brush drop-off gate will remain open until the end of May and mulch is available to residents free of charge.
- The Permits and Codes Department was only accepting applications, issuing permits and doing inspections for "life-sustaining" projects such as health care facilities, residential emergency repairs, and work being conducted in connection with a DCED waiver. Starting May 8, 2020, the Township started accepting applications and issuing building permits for all construction activities.
- Police, Fire and EMS services remain available and ready to respond to the emergency needs of residents and businesses. The Township is asking residents and businesses for donations of masks, gloves or other personal protective equipment to provide to emergency services. Please drop all donations off in the blue bin outside of the York Township Municipal Building during weekdays.

- The Township is conducting our public meetings via video conferencing software during this time. For more information, go to the Township web page and click on an agenda for an upcoming meeting: <http://www.yorktownship.com/boards/>.

## ZONING

### YARD SALES

If you're thinking of having a yard sale to make a few bucks selling off your unwanted treasures, please remember to stop by the Township for a Yard Sale Permit and take a minute to read over the following information:

**Frequency and duration requirements; permissible and prohibited sales.** Two yard sales are permissible per household in any twelve-month period. The maximum duration of each sale shall be two consecutive calendar days between the hours of 9:00 am and 9:00 pm prevailing time. No merchandise intended to be sold shall be displayed on the premises except for one hour before and during the hours of sale. No amplified sounds shall be permitted in connection with the sale.

**Permits.** No yard sale may be held until a permit therefore has been obtained. The permit cost shall be as established from time to time by the Board of Commissioners. All permit fees shall be paid to the township prior to issuance of the permit. The permit granted by the Township shall be prominently displayed on the premises during the sale.

### **On-site garage/yard sale signs**

Maximum permitted number – 2 per sale  
Maximum permitted sign area – 6 square feet per sign  
Permitted time frame – Between 2 days prior to and during the sale. No more than 2 consecutive periods totaling 12 days during any calendar year.

### **Off-site garage/yard sale signs with written permission of landowner**

Maximum permitted number – 2 per sale, 1 per property  
Maximum permitted sign area – 1 square foot per sign  
Permitted time frame – Only on the day of the sale. No more than 4 days during any calendar year.

### PERMITS FOR DRIVEWAY OVERLAY

If you are planning to have your driveway overlaid with a new layer of blacktop this year, please keep in mind that a zoning permit is necessary and it is the responsibility of the homeowner to ensure the permit is in place prior to start of any work by your contractor. Sealing of your driveway does not require a permit. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Township Office.

### 2020 STREET PAVING/PAVEMENT PRESERVATION

As of March 20<sup>th</sup> 2020, the following streets were selected to be re-paved this summer.

- Green Valley Road from Honey Valley Road to Iron Stone Hill Road – repaved
- New School Lane from Blymire Road to South Pleasant Avenue – repaved
- Kirch Road from Powder Mill Road to Radnor Road – repaved
- Primrose Lane from Chestnut Run Road to Chestnut Run Road – repaved
- Chestnut Run Road from Chestnut Hill Road to Primrose Lane – repaved
- Arbor Drive from South Franklin Street to Winterstown Road – reclaimed/repaved
- South Park Street ext. from Horn Road to North Hopewell Twp. – preservation
- South Park Street from Aldinger Drive to South Franklin Street – preservation
- Mellinger Drive from Aldinger Drive to Ridgelynn Drive – preservation
- Aldinger Drive from Stine Hill Road to South Park Street – preservation
- Stine Hill Road from South Pleasant Avenue to county bridge – preservation
- South Pleasant Avenue ext. from Iron Stone Hill Road to Hess Farm Road – preservation
- Curds Way from Country Club Road to end – preservation

Due to the timing of this newsletter edition, the contracts were not in place and it is possible that changes to the list may have occurred. Please check the York Township website ([www.yorktownship.com](http://www.yorktownship.com)) after April 30, 2020 for the final list of streets to be re-paved in 2020.

### OBSTRUCTIONS THAT OVERHANG THE ROAD

Please be aware that as property owners in York Township, you are responsible to keep your property clear from any obstructions that overhang the edge of the road. Examples include but are not limited to: tree limbs, shrubbery, hedges, grassy areas, mailboxes, fencing, etc. Many activities occur close to the curb with large vehicles that can be impacted when these obstructions exist. Examples include snow and ice removal, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, school bus travel, etc. Overgrown tree limbs and vegetation also impact the sight distance for the motoring public which can be a safety concern. Refer to Ordinance # 2014-5 found on the website for the specific requirements.



## STORMWATER

### 2020 DALLASTOWN AREA HIGH SCHOOL SCIENCE & ENGINEERING FAIR WINNERS

York Township congratulates the 2020 York Township Science & Engineering Fair scholarship winners. York Township provides scholarships for the best junior and senior “Water Quality or Stormwater Management Project” as part of our stormwater management program.

The senior project winner selected was “I’m Trying to Breathe,” by **Rylee Dunkerley**, 10<sup>th</sup> grade. The purpose of Rylee’s experiment was to test different salt concentrations in water and study the effect of that on dissolved oxygen.

The junior project winner selected was “How does the Amount of Iodized Salt Added to Tap Water Affect the Density?” by **Rachel Miller**, 9<sup>th</sup> grade. The purpose of Rachel’s experiment was to test how the amount of salt added to water affected the density.

## STORMWATER

### WHY SHOULD I CARE ABOUT STORM DRAINS ANYWAY?

Storm drains, otherwise known as inlets, are designed to remove stormwater runoff from streets and other impervious surfaces to prevent flooding. Currently, there are 2,957 inlets in York Township. These inlets are connected directly to local streams and creeks via the Township's MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) which means anything dumped into them goes directly into the watershed **untreated**.

Any debris such as leaves, plastic cups, trash, etc. placed in or on top of storm drains can block them, causing stormwater to back up and flood streets. Please do not ever dump motor oil, paint, pet waste, antifreeze, grease, gasoline, cigarette butts, etc., into storm drains as these can lower water quality and be harmful to wildlife living in and around streams, creeks and rivers. The pollution of waterways can also harm humans using them for recreation or those who get their water supply from wells.

Our local waterways are part of the Susquehanna River basin, which drains into the Susquehanna River, and subsequently, the Chesapeake Bay. The Chesapeake Bay is North America's largest and most biologically diverse estuary, home to more than 3,600 species of plants, fish, and animals. For over 300 years, the Bay and its tributaries have sustained the region's economy and defined its traditions and culture. It is a resource of extraordinary productivity, worthy of the highest levels of protection and restoration. Accordingly, in 1983 and 1987, the states of Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, the District of Columbia, the Chesapeake Bay Commission and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, representing the federal government, signed historic agreements that established the Chesapeake Bay Program partnership to protect and restore the Chesapeake Bay's ecosystem.

In an effort to help clean our local streams and the Bay, we will be installing storm drain markers at several locations throughout the Township in early Fall. These **NO DUMPING - DRAINS TO CREEK** markers will serve as an educational tool for residents to help prevent pollution of waterways by reminding people that storm drains are connected directly into the municipal storm sewer system. The markers will help remind people to think about what they throw down on the ground and help reduce erosion and runoff sediment, nutrients, oils, litter bug pollutants, runoff of chemicals and fertilizers from lawn care, leaking oils and gasoline from cars, and other potential pollutants that are currently running into these drains.

## RECYCLING

### YARD/WOODY WASTE

Township residents are encouraged to recycle their yard/woody waste by either the curbside collection or at the Township drop-off facility. Material such as tree and shrubbery trimmings and other organic landscape vegetation no larger than 8" in diameter is accepted. In no instance should anything other than the aforementioned items be placed in the brown Kraft bags for collection or drop off. **NO grass, weeds, dirt, stones, fruit & vegetable scraps, trash or recyclables are acceptable.** The Township has been experiencing some of these items "hidden" in the bottom of the Kraft bags which causes damage to the equipment used to process the yard/ woody waste into mulch.

### COMMERCIAL RECYCLING IS REQUIRED BY LAW

Pennsylvania State Act 101 of 1988 and York Township Ordinance 2006-12 require nonresidential establishments to recycle. Nonresidential establishments includes all commercial, municipal, institutional, and community groups that do not fit into a residential category. To comply with the State and Local laws, you are required to recycle the following items:

- Aluminum
- High-Grade Office Paper
- Corrugated Paper (cardboard)
- Glass (clear, brown and green)
- Steel and bimetallic can
- Leaf Waste

## RECYCLING

### RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) items shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight in the evening when collection occurs.

#### **Important guidelines to keep in mind for residential trash collection services are as follows:**

On April 10, 2018 the York Township Board of Commissioners awarded the residential trash collection contract to Penn Waste for the next four years. The quarterly fees for basic service of (3) 32-gallon bags or cans of trash, unlimited recycling with cart, one large item per week, 12 items per year curbside yard waste collection and a Township administration fee for \$1.50. For the first time since 2017, York County Solid Waste Authority must increase the cost of disposal of solid waste beginning January 1, 2020 for \$62 per ton to \$65 per ton. This tipping fee equates to a 77¢ increase per quarter per household added to the Penn Waste costs allowed under the current residential contract. Please note the new rates as follows:

**January 1, 2020 – June 30, 2020 = \$50.15 per quarter**  
**July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021 = \$51.59 per quarter**  
**July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022 = \$53.12 per quarter**

The optional 96-gallon mobile trash cart rental fee will be:

**July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 = \$11.80 per quarter**  
**July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021 = \$12.20 per quarter**  
**July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022 = \$12.55 per quarter**

The price for extra service bags will remain at \$4.00 each from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 and will increase to \$4.50 for July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2022.

**Large (Bulk) Items:** If your waste collection falls under the Township residential contract (directly billed by Penn Waste), you are entitled to place one large (bulk) item out per week with your regular trash and recycling. You only need to contact Penn Waste in advance if the item contains refrigerant (i.e. refrigerator, dehumidifier, air conditioner). Bulk items are those which cannot be disposed in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people (i.e. sofa, mattress, carpet, etc.) Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their rent or condo/homeowners fee must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.

**Round Recycling Bins:** Are the property of York Township, not the contracted hauler. The bins should remain with the property if sold. The bins are partially funded through a State recycling grant. If you never received a 32-gallon bin and you are billed directly by Penn Waste, you may pick one up at the Township offices. If your bin is cracked or broken, you must bring it to the Township office to obtain another bin. Additional bins may be purchased for a fee of \$7.50. Recycling bin stickers are available free of charge for those who wish to provide their own smaller bin for recycling.

If you are not directly billed by Penn Waste and your refuse service is provided through your landlord, condo association, or homeowner's association, you must contact the landlord or association to get a recycling bin through your refuse hauler.

Recyclables must be placed in separate bin from trash and are picked up on your regular trash day. Replacement bins are available at the Township Administrative Office or the Public Works Department.

### WASTE OIL DISPOSAL

Waste oil (motor, cooking, transmission) may be dropped off at the Public Works Service Building M-F from 7:30 am – 3:00 pm. You may enter the lower restricted area for this purpose. Drop the product off at the end of the Service Building, smaller of the two buildings, at the designated area identified by a sign. Do not drop off products after hours. We do not accept gasoline or engine coolant (anti-freeze). **Please be aware that the site is under constant video surveillance.**

### CART PLACEMENT IS IMPORTANT!

With new single operator vehicles (SOV) now being utilized in the Penn Waste collection fleet, it is important to properly place trash and recycling carts curbside to reduce employee injuries and property damage. Carts should be a minimum of **3 feet** from all other objects, including mailbox posts and from each other. Please place the cart with the lid opening and pick-up bar facing the street.



# RECYCLING

## RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING

### CAN BE INCLUDED:

**Metal** – aluminum beverage cans, steel food and beverage cans, empty aerosol cans, empty paint cans

**Glass** – clear, brown, and green glass food and beverage containers

**Plastics** – bottles and jugs #1, #2, & #5, neck narrower than the sides of the bottle

**Newspaper** – clean and dry, no food contact

**Cardboard** – dry and flattened, no food contact

**Cartons** – milk, juice, soup, wine, broth, cream, egg substitutes

### CANNOT BE INCLUDED:

**Soiled Materials** – dirty diapers, wet cardboard, food waste, food-soiled materials, used paper towels or tissues

**Hazardous Materials & Medical Waste** – all solvent, oil, chemical containers, propane tanks, pool chemicals, \*batteries, and NEEDLES

**Electronic Waste** – computers, computer accessories, television, monitors, and e-readers

**Packing Materials** – styrofoam, packing peanuts, shredded paper, and bubble wrap

**Lights & Glassware** – light bulbs, string of lights, drinking glasses, broken glass, and mirrors

**Paper & Paperboard** – newspaper inserts, magazines, catalogs/brochures, envelopes & junk mail, food boxes (i.e. cereal & Jell-O), pizza boxes, paper towel & toilet paper rolls, office paper (any color), tissue boxes, phones books, and other soft cover books.

\*Household (alkaline) batteries can be placed in the trash. Rechargeable batteries can be recycled at select retailers.

\*\*Plastic bags should be recycled at grocery stores and department stores, including Walmart, Target, etc.

## RESIDENTIAL BRUSH DROP OFF

Brush is defined as tree limbs, shrubbery, leaves and the like (no grass) no larger than 8 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length. York Township accepts brush from York Township residents only as part of our recycling efforts. Brush recycling is intended to clean up small amounts of debris from residential properties. The program is not intended to accept large tree removal projects. Large projects, such as removing entire trees, should employ the services of a commercial contractor. If you have large amounts of material to dispose, please contact York Township first for approval.

In addition, we suspect non-Township residents are illegally dropping brush at the Township site. In response to this, we may require proof of residency or begin to limit the disposal open times.

The drop-off site is located at the Township Building beyond the gate between the two signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

During the months of March through November, the drop-off site will be open for self-serve (unassisted) for 18 consecutive days beginning on the first Friday of the month and closing three Mondays later. Daily hours are dawn to dusk. See specific dates below.

\*June 5 – 22

\*July 3 – 20

\*August 7 – 24

\*September 4 – 21

\*October 2 – 19

\*November 6 – 23

We ask that you participate in this program responsibly by not dumping unlawful items at the site. Examples are garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings, etc.

All other material and items you see beyond the gate are for Township use only and are not meant for the general public to use or take. If you see a violation, please report it to the Township or York Area Regional Police Department. The site is under constant video surveillance.

Public Works will process the brush into mulch that will be made available to Township residents currently free of charge and on a first come first serve basis. The mulch pile is located in front of the gate (left side). **EVEN THOUGH THE GATE MAY BE OPEN, DO NOT DRIVE PAST THE GATE WHEN THE SITE IS CLOSED, AS INDICATED BY THE RED SIGN ON THE LEFT GATE AND THE ELECTRONIC SIGN BOARD.** Mulch may not be available at all times. Mulch availability and the times and dates of brush recycling are subject to change at Township discretion.



## RECYCLING

### RESIDENTIAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents ONLY and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to noon at the Small Load Drop-Off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406.

#### ACCEPTED ITEMS:

- Computer – Devices/PCs/Laptops/Servers
- Monitors/Television
- Networking Devices
- Printing Devices
- Receivers
- Communication Devices
- Power Supplies

#### NOT ACCEPTED:

- Any fossil fuel or materials used in collecting fossil fuels
- Any infectious or biological waste
- Any media contaminated with oils
- Any chemicals, oils or powders
- Any equipment that contains chemicals of any kind

### CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Please follow these guidelines when placing yard waste for collection: Place curbside by 6:00 am on the designated Saturdays. The hauler starts promptly at 6:00 am and quickly moves through the township as they do not need to stop at every residence. Yard waste includes material such as tree trimmings, shrubbery and other organic landscape vegetation no larger than 8" in diameter.

Yard waste DOES NOT include: grass clippings, weeds, fruit and vegetable scraps, tree stumps, dirt and stones, or any trash or recyclable materials. Prepare for collection: Place yard waste in biodegradable brown kraft bags or bundle with biodegradable twine in bundles no longer than 4 feet in length, not weighing more than 50 pounds. You may also use the round blue 32 gallon recycle bins or similar 32 gallon can without a lid. The yard waste must be visible to the hauler.

Yard waste in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected on the designated Saturday yard waste collection days.

### NATIONWIDE RECYCLING CRISIS

Unfortunately, due to the "hopeful recycling" many citizens have done in the past, our recyclables have been contaminated with items that DO NOT belong in the recycling stream (garden hoses, scrap metal, plastic toys, disposable diapers). The excessive contamination has caused China, the world's largest consumer of recycled materials, to reject most recyclables from the United States. New recycling guidelines have been set forth to encourage residents "back to the basics" in order to clean up the recycling stream. The two major changes are:

2. **Newspaper/Cardboard** – clean, dry and flattened newspaper and cardboard only, NO food contact

## THIS IS WHY WE PLAN AND PREPARE

The core functions of Emergency Management are: **Prepare, Prevent, Respond, Recover, Mitigate**. These are functions that municipal EMAs perform for their townships and boroughs, that County EMAs perform for their counties, that state EMAs perform, and that FEMA performs for the nation. Each level of the hierarchy has different functional areas in any disaster or emergency.

The level that is closest to the citizens is the municipal level. We are the EMAs that live in the same communities that you do. Our homes, our families, our fuzzy animals are here, just like yours. We shop in the same stores and use the same services that you do.

As we compose this article, even though you are reading it in June, it is March, and the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic is beginning to ramp up. The first positive patients have been diagnosed in York County. We are currently working to guide you through **responding to** the evolving situation, through our Facebook page primarily (<https://www.facebook.com/YorkTownshipEMA/>). Nearly 6 weeks before the first cases in PA were diagnosed, we were posting important information about **planning** and **preparing**.

You see ... the functions that WE perform ... are the functions that EACH PERSON needs to perform in their individual lives. **We are each our own personal EMA!** In terms of preparing: we talk about having an emergency plan, having money saved and cash on hand, having a communication plan, having provisions and medications to carry your family through a period where you cannot obtain them. You see now. It is not abstractions and wacky prepper stuff. It is real, and it is critical for you to be prepared, because emergencies can happen at ANY time. Your ability to navigate the circumstances of an emergency directly correlate to your level of preparedness. You don't need a bunker in the back yard. But you do need stuff, and you do need a plan.

Our families, our communities, and our businesses will **recover** from this emergency. There will be losses, and tragedies, and there will be stories that inspire us about how people can rise above difficult times to help others. And we will learn.

Each person living through these times has made mistakes and is learning lessons. We sure are in EMA. We will take the lessons we learn, and we will improve our emergency plans, so that the next time an emergency occurs, we will have **mitigated**, or decreased the damage-potential of the emergency. When you do the same thing in your personal lives, you will find that the next emergency doesn't hit quite as hard.

**York Regional Emergency Medical Services Inc.** (formerly Yoe Ambulance Service) has been serving from Yoe Fire Company since 1972 and from Goodwill Fire Company since 2004. We serve a primary population of 40,000+ people residing in four municipalities; Yoe Borough, Dallastown Borough, Windsor Township and York Township. We provide 24-hour Advanced Life Support (ALS) ambulance service from each station. Peak-hour units are staffed from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm, weekdays, in order to enhance the level of service provided during this high demand period.

York Regional Emergency Medical Services Inc. is a non-profit, 501(c)3, charitable organization incorporated in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. We are licensed by the Pennsylvania Department of Health and are dispatched by the York County Department of Emergency Services – 911 Center.

The 2020 Annual Subscription requests will be mailed in March. While many Subscriptions expire at different times during the year, the bulk of our Subscribers are on an annual cycle for each Spring. The Subscription is available to the residents and businesses of Yoe and Dallastown Boroughs, and those portions of York Township and Windsor Township serviced by York Regional EMS. ### ***Why Should I Buy an Ambulance Subscription?***

#### **Peace of Mind in an Emergency:**

Although many patients have medical insurance coverage of some type, most insurance plans cover only a portion of the fees associated with transportation to the hospital or will pay for only those fees they consider to be “usual and customary.” Unfortunately, this amount is usually far below our cost to provide 24-hour emergency ambulance service to a population of 40,000+ citizens. Any portion of the fees not covered by private insurance becomes an out-of-pocket expense for the patient.

As a *York Regional EMS Subscriber*, we will only bill Primary and Secondary Insurance providers. Payment from a subscriber's insurance carrier will satisfy your obligation to us for our service costs\*. Non-Subscribers are responsible for payment in full for services, regardless of the amount covered by their insurance carrier. Subscribers shall forward any payments received directly from their insurance carrier to York Regional EMS immediately upon receipt.

The demand for emergency medical services has grown dramatically over the past several years. If we are already committed to an emergency when you need us, the 911 Center will dispatch the next closest available ambulance service. ## PARTICIPATION AND REGISTRATION GUIDELINES

- **REGISTRATION FORMS for various programs** will be placed online at [www.yorktownshiprec.com](http://www.yorktownshiprec.com) as they become available. Forms for some programs may also be picked up at the YTRec Office.
- **ADVANCE PAYMENT** is required for all programs as it will ensure a space in the class/program. Checks may be made payable to York Township.
- **PARTICIPATION** in any class/program/event constitutes permission to use likeness in promotional materials.
- **THE DEPARTMENT** is **NOT** responsible for injuries while participating in any of its activities.
- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician will be required. No refunds for Bus Trips will be given when spots are cancelled less than 30 days before trip unless the trip is cancelled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- **PROGRAM SIZE** is limited and will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.
- **PROGRAM DATES & TIMES** are contingent on availability of facilities and are subject to change.
- **PROGRAMS** postponed or not held by the instructor due to emergencies will be made up by the instructor or fees will be prorated. Classes missed by the participant will not be made up.
- **POLICY ON CHILDREN**—Participants are not permitted to bring children with them to class. Enrollment age is included with the description of most of the classes.
- **CANCELLATIONS**—In case of inclement weather, we may cancel our programs. Remember, if the Dallastown Area School District cancels classes, then our activities are cancelled also. ## PARK RULES/HOURS

- All Township Parks, with the exception of York Township Park, are closed between dusk to dawn. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
- No littering.
- No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
- **NO GOLFING IN PARKS.** Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
- Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned. Grills may not be placed on picnic tables.
- No solicitation.
- **No alcoholic beverages or drugs.** No one shall use or be under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs in any parks.
- **Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, rifles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.**
- Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
- Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
- No facilities may be reserved or events scheduled without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
- Parks may be closed if hazardous conditions endanger life or property. In said event, there should be no trespassing on park property in said times.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
- Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
- **No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game trucks etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.**
