FROM THE MANAGER'S DESK

YORK TOWNSHIP REACHES TENTATIVE SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT WITH PA AMERICAN WATER

The Townships of York, West Manchester, Manchester, Spring Garden, and the Borough of North York (Municipalities) have tentatively reached a settlement with PA American Water with regard to the sale of the York City wastewater treatment plant, to which all five Municipalities connect and send wastewater.

In March 2021, York Township's leadership was placed in a difficult situation when York City decided to sell their wastewater treatment plant. Since the beginning of the sale process, the focus of all the involved Municipalities has been steadfast to act in the best interest of ratepayers by delivering fair and predictable rates. While no one wants increased sewer rates, our leadership worked extremely hard to negotiate the best possible long-term outcome for the residents.

After intense and complicated negotiations, we are pleased to announce that a settlement has been reached that in principle has fulfilled our goals, including:

- Following a possible initial rate increase, there would be a three-year rate freeze for our ratepayers.
- A 40-year period of rate certainty with fair rate increases based on the Consumer Price Index, after the three-year rate freeze.
- The ability to seek alternative and potentially less expensive treatment options if the Public Utility Commission (PUC) changes our contractual rate.
- A professional and competent operator who will bill the Municipalities accurately.

Sewer rates for York Township ratepayers will not increase in 2022 due to the Township Board of Commissioners approval of the 2022 Budget which included the utilization of reserve sewer funds to offset any potential mid-year increases. While we were successful in negotiating a significantly lower sewer rate with PA American Water than initially proposed, it is still an increase over current rates paid to York City and a preliminary analysis resulted in the realization that an increase in quarterly sewer rates is going to be necessary in the future. New quarterly sewer rates will be determined with the preparation of the Township's 2023 Budget later this year.

The Municipalities' leadership and staff look forward to building a mutually beneficial relationship with PA American Water moving forward and appreciate everyone who has participated in and supported this effort.

<u>SHENTEL – GLO FIBER HIGH-SPEED</u> <u>INTERNET SERVICE</u> <u>COMING TO YORK TOWNSHIP</u>

On July 13, 2021, the York Township Board of Commissioners approved a cable franchise agreement with Shentel Communications to provide fiber internet, phone, and television services within York Township. In January 2022, Township staff met with Shentel representatives regarding extending Glo Fiber optic network services into the Township.

Shentel will be starting construction in the northern part of the Township in early summer and finishing their planned buildout by the end of the year. Representatives from Glo Fiber will be placing door hangers at the properties in each construction area prior to work commencing.

Shentel's target is to reach 8,500 customers within the Township providing options of high-speed internet, streaming TV, and fiber phone services.

FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR'S DESK

The 2022/23 School Tax Bill will be mailed out on 7/15/22. The discount date for the tax bills will be 9/15/22. Please let me know if you haven't received your School Tax Bill, or if you have moved and want your tax bills sent to your new address. If you are 65 years or older, or over 50 and a widow/widower, or you are 18 and older, permanently disabled and on SSI, you may qualify for the Property Tax or a Rent Rebate from Pennsylvania. OBSTRUCTIONS THAT OVERHANG THE ROAD

Please be aware that as property owners in York Township, you are responsible to keep your property clear from any obstructions that overhang the edge of the road. Examples include, but are not limited to: tree limbs, shrubbery, hedges, grassy areas, mailboxes, fencing, etc. Many activities occur close to the curb with large vehicles that can be impacted when these obstructions exist. Examples include snow and ice removal, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, school bus travel, etc. Overgrown tree limbs and vegetation also impact the sight distance for the motoring public which can be a safety concern. Refer to Ordinance # 2014-5 found on the website for the specific requirements.



If you are on NextDoor, there is a group called CERT of York Township that we created. You are welcome to join to discuss CERT and learn about the program, opportunities, etc.

We are also on <u>NextDoor</u>. To see our posts, be sure that in your app Settings, you have enabled Notifications from Public Agencies (you can select which agencies you want to receive in your NextDoor feed). If you provide your cell number to NextDoor, we can even push out Emergency text alerts (such as shelter in place, boil water advisory, etc.) to your phone and/or email. (We don't have access to that contact information, Nextdoor keeps that <u>private</u>.) See the graphic showing notification settings.

If you aren't on Nextdoor, don't worry, important alerts will always be emailed if you have



signed up for Emergency Alerts from the township (see the main page at <u>www.yorktownship.com</u>, on the right side of the page). Public safety alerts are released to the news media also.

Severe Weather Preparedness: June 1 is the start of Hurricane Season. In 2021, Tropical Depression Fred and the remnants of Hurricane Ida passed through our area, causing damage to homes, businesses, roads, municipal infrastructure, etc. Ida resulted in a Federal disaster declaration for York County due to widespread damages. Tropical Depression Fred spawned a tornado in North Hopewell Township <u>very close</u> to York Township's southern border.

While tropical storms are not common, even "routine" thunderstorms passing through can pack a damaging punch with severe winds, hail, and torrential rains, smaller in scale but still potentially damaging.

Your best strategy in mitigating damage is to <u>stay aware</u> of weather forecasts and advisories. Plan your activities with an eye on what "might" occur, and have a plan for what you will do if that severe weather does come your way. If you are at home and severe weather is forecasted, be sure to prep your home environment (deck, patio, porches, etc.) to protect it from storm effects. Some effective mitigations against storm damages include: ensuring rain gutters are clear and that water flows away from the foundation, verifying that your sump pump is operational, moving valuable objects from basement level to higher levels, taking down dead tree limbs before the wind does, and other proactive measures! We know that storms will come ... what can you do this weekend to mitigate the effects of storm damage?

ZONING

BUILDING PERMIT EXPIRATIONS

All building permits issued by York Township are valid for one year. If work is not completed within one year, an extension may be requested. Beginning July 1, 2022, all permit extensions will be subject to applicable fees in accordance with the York Township Fee Schedule. If you have any questions, please contact the Township Office.

LAWS REGULATING FIREWORKS

House Bill 542 was signed into law on October 30, 2017, amending Pennsylvania's Fireworks law and greatly expanding the ability of the general public to purchase and use consumer fireworks. In addition, York Township adopted additional regulations restricting the hours and duration for the discharge of fireworks within the Township and also prohibiting the discharge of fireworks during a declared Burn Ban.

ZONING

YARD SALE TIME

Frequency and duration requirements. Two-yard sales are permissible per household in any twelve-month period. The maximum duration of each sale shall be two consecutive calendar days between the hours of 9:00 am and 9:00 pm prevailing time.

Permits. The permit cost is \$5.00 and can be purchased in the Finance Department. No yard sale may be held until a permit has been obtained. The permit placard shall be prominently displayed on the premises during the sale.

On-site garage/yard sale signs

Maximum permitted number – 2 per sale Maximum permitted sign area – 6 square feet per sign Permitted time frame – Between 2 days prior to and during the sale. No more than 2 consecutive periods totaling 12 days during any calendar year.

Off-site garage/yard sale signs with written permission of landowner

Maximum permitted number – 2 per sale, 1 per property Maximum permitted sign area – 1 square foot per sign Permitted time frame – Only on the day of the sale. No more than 4 days during any calendar year.

ORDINANCE REVIEW - CHAPTER 107: BURNING, OUTDOOR

Definitions. LEAF WASTE — Leaves, garden residue, shrubbery and tree trimmings and similar materials, but not including grass clippings.

OPEN BURNING — Any fire not confined or contained in a receptacle of acceptable construction (e.g., metal, masonry to other nonflammable material), 55 gallons or smaller, and equipped with a top so constructed as to prevent fly ash from escaping into the atmosphere.

PERSON — Any natural person, partnership, association, firm, company, or corporation or other entity. RECYCLABLE — Any material that is required to be recycled in York Township under Pa. Act 101, including woody yard waste and leaves.

Prohibited acts. No person under the age of 18 shall be permitted to regulate, manage or control an open burning, shall conduct an open burning between sunset and sunrise; shall conduct an open burning within 50 feet of any building; shall conduct an open burning within 25 feet of any adjoining property line; shall conduct an open burning on any public or private street, street right-of-way, alley, road or highway; shall conduct an open burning of recyclable or leaf waste; shall conduct an open burning consisting of construction residue and waste.

Exemptions. The performance of an official duty of any public officer, if the open burning is necessary for the prevention of a fire hazard which cannot be abated by any other means; an open burning required for the protection of public health at the direction of the appropriate public officer; instructing personnel in firefighting when approved by a Fire Chief in their first response area in York Township; ceremonies and activities done under adult supervision, such as bonfires done in conjunction with school-related or civic functions scouting and related activities, group wiener roasts or campfires; agricultural management and conservation practices and protection, provided burning is located 100 feet or more from any building or structure. Materials must originate from the property on which the open burning is being conducted.

Control and extinguishment. All fires, whether or not an open burning, shall be kept under competent and continuous supervision. All flammable and combustible materials not in use as a fuel for a fire shall be removed a sufficient distance from a fire as to not constitute a hazard. Proper notification shall be made to the York County Emergency Center (911) of the time, place and period of an open burning. All fires, ashes and coals shall be thoroughly extinguished after the use thereof has been completed. Notification to the York County Emergency Center (911) shall be made when the open burning is completed.

Enforcement; violations and penalties. The York Township Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the York County Regional Police Department to enforce the provisions of this chapter in the same manner provided for the enforcement of summary offenses under the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter shall, upon summary conviction, be subject to a penalty of not less than \$50 nor more than \$600 per violation. Should such person refuse or neglect to pay such penalty, such person shall be subject to imprisonment to the extent allowed by law for the punishment of summary offenses. A separate offense shall arise for each day or portion thereof in which a violation is found to exist or for each section of this chapter which is found to have been violated.



SCOOP THE POOP

Adaptation from the Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay

Let's face it – we all love our pets, yet no one likes picking up after them. But how much trouble does waste from pups and other pets cause? As it turns out, what Fido and Fluffy leave behind can be pretty "ruff" on the Chesapeake Bay watershed.

There are over 84 million dogs living in the United States, creating 22.9 trillion pounds of waste per year – much of which is left on lawns, sidewalks, trails, and parks. According to Doody Calls, a pet waste management service, this could fill a line of tractor-trailers stretching from NYC to Los Angeles and back to Austin, Texas. And that's only dogs!

All that puppy poo and feline feces can actually cause several water quality issues. Like fertilizer, oil, and sediment, pet waste is considered a non-point source pollutant by the Environmental Protection Agency. That means pet waste contains nutrients like nitrogen and phosphorus that can fuel toxic algal blooms and reduce oxygen levels. If left on the grass, rain will wash these nutrients into storm drains and local waterways, harming the plants and wildlife that live there.

Unlike other runoff culprits we've discussed, pet waste also contains bacteria and parasites like ringworm, salmonella, Giardia, and E. coli – to name just a few. Just one gram of dog waste can contain up to 23 million fecal coliform bacteria. This is known to cause serious health problems in humans, like intestinal illness and kidney disorders. Once these waterborne pathogens enter the watershed, it can make it unfit for swimming and other recreational activities.

As pet owners, it is our responsibility to pick up after our pets. Even this simple act can have a huge impact on the health of local waterways and the Chesapeake Bay. Here are some Runoff Busters-approved "Doo"s and Don'ts to make man's best friend the Bay's best friend too:

"Doo"s:

- Flush the poo down the toilet, throw it in the trash, or bury it six inches deep in the ground (sans plastic bag).
- Use designated pet waste stations where available.
- Bring a small trowel or "pooper-scooper" during walks and re-use a plastic shopping bag for easy disposal.
- Tie plastic bags to your dog's leash, and store a few in your car.
- Take the "Scoop the Poop" pledge.

Don'ts:

- Don't forget to scoop the poop in your own yard! (Especially before it rains).
- Don't let your pet take care of business directly on the pavement- choose a grassy area instead.
- Don't place pet poop in a compost pile. Yes, manure can sometimes be used as fertilizer, but only when it comes from herbivores like horses or cows.

PENN WASTE CONTRACT EXTENSION ADDENDUM FOR TRASH AND RECYCLING COLLECTION SERVICES THROUGH JUNE 2024

Beginning July 1, 2022, York Township residents will see an increase in their quarterly fees for the collection of solid waste and recyclable materials from their homes. At the March 8, 2022, meeting, the Board of Commissioners approved a two-year extension to the existing Penn Waste contract through June 2024. Based on current bids received by other municipalities and discussions with service providers, it was determined that rebidding trash service in lieu of opting for the contract extension, would likely have resulted in an increased cost of approximately 30%-50% for the 2022-2023 service year. Current bidding increases are due to many factors such as limited recycling options, CDL driver and labor shortages, higher equipment costs and insurance costs, higher tipping fees at the York County incinerator, and higher residential average weekly volumes due to more people working from home.

For residents utilizing the 96-gallon mobile cart service, the current cost is \$66.34 per quarter. Beginning July 1, 2022, the cost will increase to \$78.00 per quarter. Beginning July 1, 2023, the cost will increase to \$81.90 per quarter.

For residents utilizing the 3-bag or can service, the current cost is \$53.79 per quarter. Beginning July 1, 2022, the cost will increase to \$66.00 per quarter. Beginning July 1, 2023, the cost will increase to \$69.30 per quarter.

YARD / WOODY WASTE COLLECTION

Township residents are encouraged to recycle their yard/woody waste by either curbside collection or at the Township drop-off facility. Materials such as tree and shrubbery trimmings and other organic landscape vegetation is acceptable provided the limbs are no larger than **8 inches in diameter** and no longer than **4 feet long** (NOTE: Township brush dimensions are no larger than 8 inches in diameter and no longer than **6 feet long**). **Grass, weeds, dirt, stones, fruit & vegetable scraps, trash or recyclables are NOT accepted.** Yard waste must either be bundled with biodegradable twine (50-pound weight limit), placed in a brown Kraft bag or in a 32-gallon can without a lid. Yard waste placed in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected. Yard waste must be out for collection by 6:00 am on the pickup date and be visible to the hauler.

WASTE OIL DISPOSAL

Used oil (motor, cooking, transmission) can be dropped off at the Public Works Service Building Monday – Friday from 7:00 am – 3:30 pm. We do not accept gasoline or engine coolant (anti-freeze). **Please be aware that the site is under constant video surveillance.**

RECYCLING

RESIDENTIAL BRUSH DROP OFF

Brush is defined as tree limbs, shrubbery, leaves and the like (no grass) no larger than **8 inches in diameter** and **6 feet in length**. York Township accepts brush from York Township residents as part of our recycling efforts. Brush recycling is intended to clean up small amounts of debris from residential properties. The program is not intended to accept large tree removal projects. Large projects, such as removing entire trees, should employ the service of a commercial contractor. If you have large amounts of material to dispose, please contact York Township Public Works Department for approval.

The drop-off site will remain open daily, from dawn to dusk, throughout the year and will close occasionally to grind up the materials to make mulch. Please refer to the Township website for updates. The site is located at the Township Municipal Building beyond the gate between the two signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

Please participate in this program responsibly by dumping lawful items that can be safely processed by the machine. Items such as garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings, etc. will cause damage to the machines. In addition, please be mindful that the drop-off site is shared with the Public Works operations.

Public Works will process the brush into mulch that will be made available to Township residents currently free of charge and on a first-come first-served basis. The mulch pile is located in front of the gate (left side). Mulch may **not** be available at all times. Mulch availability and the times and dates of brush recycling are subject to change at the Townships discretion.

All other material and items you see beyond the gate are for Township use only and are not meant for the general public to use or take. If you see a violation, please report it to the Township or York County Regional Police Department. **The site is under constant video surveillance**.

RESIDENTIAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents ONLY and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to noon at the Small Load Drop-Off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406.

RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Penn Waste has been contracted by the Township for residential trash and recycling services. All residences are required to have trash service. Please contact Penn Waste directly at 717-767-4456 to establish services.

Each residence is permitted (3) 32-gallon bags or cans of trash, unlimited recycling with cart, one large item per week, and 12 items per year curbside yard waste collection. Additional service bags can be purchased at the York Township Finance Office for \$5.00. Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. Carts should be placed a minimum of 3 feet from all other objects and facing the street. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) items shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight on your collection day.

Large (Bulk) Items: Residential customers are entitled to place one large (bulk) item out per week with your regular trash and recycling. You only need to contact Penn Waste in advance if the item contains refrigerant or hazardous waste. Bulk items are those which cannot be disposed in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people. RABBITEXPRESS

Warm weather is for relaxing, not sitting in traffic or stressing about the cost of gas. Local transportation authority, rabbittransit, offers commuters a convenient and affordable alternative to driving to work: rabbitEXPRESS.

Designed with the commuter in mind, rabbit EXPRESS operates multiple round trips on weekdays between York and Harrisburg; York and Northern Maryland; and Gettysburg and Harrisburg. On board, free Wi-Fi makes it possible to be productive while commuting. When life happens and commuters need to get home sooner than expected, the Emergency Ride Home Program makes it possible to do so. Rabbit EXPRESS also makes connections to multiple regional transportation providers to maximize commuters' ability to reach their destination.

Riders can pay cash fare upon boarding rabbit EXPRESS, purchase 11 rides, or monthly passes. Monthly passes can be used on any rabbittransit scheduled route bus. One-way cash fare between York and Northern Maryland is \$5; York and Harrisburg is \$3.50; and Harrisburg and Gettysburg is \$3.50. 11 ride passes for routes connecting from York to Northern Maryland, York to Harrisburg or Harrisburg to Gettysburg range from \$31 to \$50; while monthly passes for the same routes range from \$95 to \$136.

ON-LOT SEPTIC SYSTEM ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Low-interest loans are available to eligible Pennsylvania homeowners who need to repair or replace their on-lot septic system or connect to a public sewer.

The assistance can help homeowners avoid or respond to municipal citations and improve the environmental health of their property. Loan terms are up to 20 years (up to 15 years for manufactured homes). There is no prepayment penalty if the loan is paid off early. The maximum loan amount is \$25,000.



PARTICIPATION AND REGISTRATION GUIDELINES

- **REGISTRATION FORMS for various programs** will be placed online at <u>www.yorktownshiprec.com</u> as they become available. Forms for some programs may also be picked up at the YTRec Office.
- ADVANCE PAYMENT is required for all programs as it will ensure a space in the class/program. Checks may be made payable to York Township.
- PARTICIPATION in any class/program/event constitutes permission to use likeness in promotional materials.
- THE DEPARTMENT is NOT responsible for injuries while participating in any of its activities.
- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician will be required. No refunds for Bus Trips will be given when spots are cancelled less than 30 days before trip unless the trip is cancelled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- **PROGRAM SIZE** is limited and will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.
- PROGRAM DATES & TIMES are contingent on availability of facilities and are subject to change.
- **PROGRAMS** postponed or not held by the instructor due to emergencies will be made up by the instructor or fees will be prorated. Classes missed by the participant will not be made up.
- **POLICY ON CHILDREN**—Participants are not permitted to bring children with them to class. Enrollment age is included with the description of most of the classes.

PARK RULES/HOURS

- All Township Parks, with the exception of York Township Park, are closed between dusk to dawn. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
- No littering.
- No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
- NO GOLFING IN PARKS. Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
- Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned. Grills may not be placed on picnic tables.
- No solicitation.
- No alcoholic beverages or drugs. No one shall use or be under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs in any parks.
- Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, riffles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.
- Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
- Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
- No facilities may be reserved or events scheduled without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
- Parks may be closed if hazardous conditions endanger life or property. In said event, there should be no trespassing on park property in said times.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
- Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
- No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game trucks etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.
