FROM THE MANAGER'S DESK

2023 BUDGET APPROVED WITH NO TAX OR SEWER INCREASES

Due to the pandemic and inflation, the Township budgeted a net deficit in both the general fund in the amount of \$598,865.00 and in the sewer fund in the amount of \$46,557.00 for 2023. The Board approved the 2023 budget with no tax or sewer increases by using unassigned fund balances or savings to cover the net deficits. The average residential property assessed at \$173,515 will pay \$215.16 of general-purpose real estate tax and \$64.20 in fire protection tax in 2023. A residential sewer customer will continue to pay \$125.00 per quarter.

ZONING

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN A SOLICITOR IS AT YOUR DOOR

Any person, firm or corporation desiring to engage in a transient (door to door) retail business in York Township, must first apply to the Township for a license. If you receive a knock at your door and the person standing on your porch is attempting to solicit your business to purchase goods or services, first ask to see their Permit for Soliciting & Peddling. The permit is a 2” x 3.5” yellow card with “Permit for Soliciting & Peddling” written at the top, along with a specific permit number issued by the Township. If they do not possess a valid permit, they may not solicit in the Township and are in violation of the Township ordinances. Please call 911 immediately to report any persons soliciting without a valid permit.

ORDINANCE REVIEW – CHAPTER 199: SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL

Please keep the following requirements in mind when clearing snow and ice from public sidewalks and/or near fire hydrants on your property this winter:

Every person in charge or control of any building or lot of land fronting or abutting on a paved sidewalk, whether as owner, tenant, occupant, lessee or otherwise, shall remove and clear away or cause to be removed or cleared away snow and/or ice from a path of at least 30 inches in width from so much of said sidewalk as is in front of or abuts on said building or lot of land.

- Except as provided in Subsection B hereof, snow and ice shall be removed from sidewalks within 12 hours after the cessation of any fall of snow, sleet or freezing rain.
- In the event that snow and/or ice on a sidewalk has become so hard that it cannot be removed without likelihood of damage to the sidewalk, the person charged with its removal shall, within the time mentioned in Subsection A hereof, cause enough sand or other abrasive to be put on the sidewalk to make travel reasonably safe and shall, as soon thereafter as weather permits, cause to be cleared a path in said sidewalk of at least 30 inches in width.

No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any snow or ice on or immediately next to a fire hydrant or on any sidewalk, roadway or loading and unloading areas of a public transportation system.

OBSTRUCTIONS THAT OVERHANG THE ROAD

Please be aware that as property owners in York Township, you are responsible to keep your property clear from any obstructions that overhang the edge of the road. Examples include but are not limited to tree limbs, shrubbery, hedges, grassy areas, mailboxes, fencing, etc. Many activities occur close to the curb with large vehicles that can be impacted when these obstructions exist. Examples include snow and ice removal, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, school bus travel, etc. Overgrown tree limbs and vegetation also impact the sight distance for the motoring public which can be a safety concern. Refer to Ordinance # 2014-5 found on the website for the specific requirements.

YORK TOWNSHIP WINTER MAINTENANCE OVERVIEW

The objective of the York Township Department of Public Works winter maintenance program is to provide safe roads to the traveling public.

WINTER MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES



We divided all Township roads into routes. An operator with pre-determined equipment is assigned to one of these routes. Most of the time this is the standard deployment, however, depending on the conditions, we may only deploy 6 operators to treat the snow emergency roads or what is designated as the priority routes. Snow emergency roads are posted with signs and

are designated as such due to factors of high traffic volume, steep grades, and areas with limited access or close proximity to the Schools, Police, Fire and Medical Facilities.

Prior to the storm, you may notice the pre-treating of certain priority roads with liquid brine. The brine is a specific concentration (23.3%) of sodium chloride that lowers the freezing point of water. Although we would like to pre-treat all of our roads, it's just not possible due to time and equipment availability. When appropriate, we plan to pretreat all of the snow emergency routes with liquid brine.



SNOW EMERGENCIES

Occasionally a snow emergency will be declared by the Township. The initial focus will be on the priority (snow emergency posted) roads. The snow emergency declaration will be broadcast on the local radio, television stations, and will be posted on the York Township website. Again, all snow emergency streets are identified with signage. After the snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful at any time during the continuance of the emergency for any person:

1. To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency routes designated; or
2. To operate a motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route in such a manner or in such a reasonable condition as to allow or permit such vehicle to become stalled on such route, either by reason of the fact that the driving wheels of such vehicle are not equipped with tire chains or effective tires or by reason of the fact that the motor fuel supply of such vehicle has been allowed to become exhausted.

Please be aware that failure to abide by the above is a violation of a Township ordinance and may result in fines and / or towing costs. For a complete listing of the streets and a full text of the ordinance, please visit the Township website.

MAILBOXES and DRIVEWAYS

York Township DOES NOT compensate property owners should their mailbox become damaged due to the removal of snow from Township roads. Any object placed in the road right-of-way, including a mailbox, fence, landscaping, etc. is at the owner's risk. The public right of way is on average 50 feet wide (25 feet from the center of the roadway).

It is suggested that you wait until after all plowing is complete before shoveling out the end of your driveway. If you do shovel out before the plows have come through, try to clear a spot upstream of your driveway. This will allow the snow from the plow to unload before the driveway. It won't prevent all snow from going back in front of your driveway, but it will reduce the amount. The snow must be plowed from the street, therefore, all driveways and properties will be affected to some degree.

STATE ROADS

Many roads within York Township are owned and maintained by PennDOT. Refer to the website for a list of all state roads. PennDOT has their own policies and procedures for winter maintenance. Please contact the local PennDOT maintenance office at 717-848-6230 for assistance.

STREET CLEANING

Street cleaning usually begins after winter maintenance is complete. It is a continuous process and does not stop until all streets have been cleaned. York Township does not clean (maintain) state roads.

STORMWATER

STORMWATER BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES FOR WINTER MAINTENANCE

Snow and ice on roads, parking lots, driveways, and sidewalks can create hazardous conditions for people and property. Snow and ice removal are best done non-chemically with plows and shovels, but the results are not always adequate to ensure safety. Chemical ice melters and/or sanding is often part of a comprehensive strategy to make winter's passage a safe one, but how do they affect water quality of our local waterways?

Salt and sand have traditionally been perceived as the cheapest and most effective materials for de-icing driving and walking surfaces. However, many people do not realize that they have hidden impacts that can detract from their overall effectiveness.

Even in small quantities, salt can:

- ❄ Contaminate groundwater and surface waters;
- ❄ Deplete the oxygen supply needed by aquatic animals and plants; and,
- ❄ Leach into the ground and change soil composition, making it hard for plants to survive.

Similarly, sand can:

- ❄ Contribute to clogged storm drains, which can cause flooding;
- ❄ Lose its effectiveness after becoming embedded in snow and ice; and,
- ❄ Enter catch basins, storm drains, and surface waters if it is not swept up each spring.

Below is a list of best management practices for effective winter maintenance and de-icing:

- ❄ **Snow and Ice Removal:** Use mechanical means before applying salt/sand, whenever possible.
- ❄ **Salt Application:** Follow manufacturer's instructions and use only enough to break the ice/pavement bond. Do not apply on vegetation or near waterways. Use less harmful deicers such as Calcium Magnesium Acetate or Sodium/Potassium Acetate.
- ❄ **Sand Application:** Use only enough to provide traction on slippery areas. Sweep up excess sand after snowmelt.
- ❄ **Snow & Ice Disposal:** Do not dispose of snow & ice in wetlands, creeks, or other waterways or directly on top of storm drains.



In an effort to protect our waterways, York Township produces and utilizes salt brine, a solution of salt and water, before inclement weather as an anti-icing or pre-treating procedure; as well as after weather events while applying rock salt. Salt brine reduces the adhesion of snow and ice to road surfaces, reducing the total amount of rock salt being used.

Following these best management practices will help prevent degradation of water quality in York Township's waterways, so please do your part to protect our streams from unnecessary stormwater pollution!

YOU ARE PREPARED (SORT OF) – HOW ABOUT YOUR PETS?

If your pets are like ours, odds are they *have not prepared* themselves for emergencies. This is where you come in! Just as you provide good food, engaging toys, and lots of attention, you get to do the emergency planning for your pets, since they refuse (we're looking at you, Fluffy). But seriously, 66% of households have pets, and evacuations involving pets create challenges that are best addressed *before*, *not during* an emergency.

1 Contact Information: Have the following numbers in your phone: • 2 emergency vet contacts (the primary might be closed or very busy) • Animal Poison Control number (888-426-4435) • Have the American Red Cross Pet First Aid app in your phone ... the guidance might make all the difference!

2 Evacuation: Make a pet backpack ("go bag"). Include things pets will need if you have to leave your home quickly. Generally, if it is not safe for you to be in the home, it is not safe for them to be there either. Consider using vet trips as practice evacuation events and try to assess and address any weaknesses in your plan.

For cats and dogs (for other pets see #5), include • food (3 days), water, and travel bowls • harnesses, leashes • carriers, cages (labeled with your name AND the pet's) • medicines (2+ weeks), basic first aid items • sanitary supplies (cat litter, poop bags, etc.) • toys, blankets, bedding • copy of veterinary and immunization records • collar with name tag, or microchip information • current photo of pet to assist with reunification if you are separated (common during disaster scenarios).

3 Where to Stay: People often do not evacuate when advised because they don't want to abandon their pets. If you plan now for having to evacuate, you will both be much safer! Disaster shelters typically do not take pets, so find pet-friendly hotels or kennels that are away from your immediate neighborhood, that will accept your type of pet. Also check with friends / relatives ahead of time, to see if they would provide temporary shelter to your pets.

4 Sheltering in Place: If you are advised to shelter in place, or cannot evacuate, get to the safest place in the home. Some pets do better if they are in their crates, away from windows, or with covers on cages. Think through what would be most comforting.

5 Other Pets: Small mammals and birds: Use a sturdy, covered carrier or cage to transport ferrets, hamsters, gerbils, rats, mice, guinea pigs, birds, etc. (Be sensitive to their environmental needs during transport in extreme temperatures.) Amphibians: Transport in small containers such as plastic shoeboxes with snap-on lids. Reptiles: Transport in a small carrier, pillowcase, or cloth sack, but take extra precautions so that the pet is not accidentally injured.

• Take needed food, dietary supplements, travel bowl, bedding, toys, and exercise device. Some reptiles do not eat daily, so feeding during an evacuation may increase stress. For environment-sensitive pets, have a thermometer / hygrometer to monitor conditions and keep the pet comfortable. Warmth can be added with small disposable hand warmers wrapped in a sock, and humidity can be added with paper towels wetted with water.

Because of their very special environmental requirements, it is generally not feasible to evacuate fish, but consider a backup power source (UPS, power station) to provide power to filtration, air pump, etc. if you have to leave them.

6 Behavior: Following disasters, pets may become defensive or fearful. Keep them under control or confined until you are back home safely.

RECYCLING

PENN WASTE TRASH AND RECYCLING COLLECTION SERVICES THROUGH JUNE 2024

York Township residents will see an increase in their quarterly fees for the collection of solid waste and recyclable materials from their homes.

For residents utilizing the 96-gallon mobile cart service, the current rate is \$78.55. Beginning July 1, 2023, the cost will increase to \$82.45 per quarter.

For residents utilizing the 3-bag or can service, the current rate is \$66.55. Beginning July 1, 2023, the cost will increase to \$69.85 per quarter.

YARD / WOODY WASTE COLLECTION

Township residents are encouraged to recycle their yard/woody waste by either curbside collection or at the Township drop-off facility. Materials such as tree and shrubbery trimmings and other organic landscape vegetation is acceptable provided the limbs are no larger than **8 inches in diameter** and no longer than **4 feet long** (NOTE: Township brush dimensions are no larger than 6 inches in diameter and no longer than **6 feet long**). **Grass, weeds, dirt, stones, fruit & vegetable scraps, trash or recyclables are NOT accepted.** Yard waste must either be bundled with biodegradable twine (50-pound weight limit), placed in a brown Kraft bag or in a 32-gallon can without a lid. Yard waste placed in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected. Yard waste must be out for collection by 6:00 am on the pickup date and be visible to the hauler.

RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION GUIDELINES

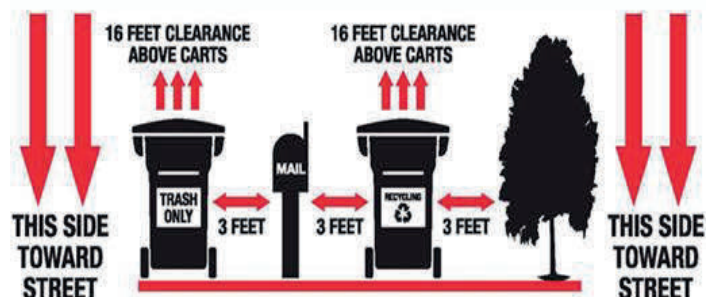
Penn Waste has been contracted by the Township for residential trash and recycling services. All residences are required to have trash service. Please contact Penn Waste directly at 717-767-4456 to establish services.

Each residence is permitted (3) 32-gallon bags or cans of trash, unlimited recycling with cart, one large item per week, and 12 items per year curbside yard waste collection. **Additional service bags can be purchased at the York Township Finance Office for \$5.00.**

Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. Carts should be placed a minimum of 3 feet from all other objects and facing the street. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) items shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight on your collection day.

Large (Bulk) Items: Residential customers are entitled to place one large (bulk) item out per week with your regular trash and recycling. You only need to contact Penn Waste in advance if the item contains refrigerant or hazardous waste. Bulk items are those which cannot be disposed in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people. Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their rent or condo/homeowners fee must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.

**Please place cart at curb with lid opening toward street.
Keep cart three feet from all objects and clear from
overhead hazards such as trees and power lines.**

PENN WASTE CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP

Penn Waste will be picking up Christmas trees curbside on Saturday, January 21, 2023.

BRUSH RECYCLING

Brush is defined as tree limbs, shrubbery, leaves and the like (no grass) no larger than 8 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length. York Township accepts brush from York Township residents only as part of our recycling efforts. Brush recycling is intended to clean up small amounts of debris from residential properties. The program is not intended to accept large tree removal projects. Large projects such as removing entire trees should employ the services of a commercial contractor. If you have large amounts of material to dispose of, please contact York Township first for approval.

The drop off site will remain open only on the weekends from Fridays at 3:30 pm until Mondays at 7:00 am. The site will close from time to time in order to grind up the raw material into mulch. Follow the website for updates. The drop off site is located at the Township Campus beyond the gate between the two signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

We ask that you participate in this program responsibly by not dumping unlawful items at the site. Examples are garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings etc.

Public Works will process the brush into mulch which will be made available to Township residents. At the present mulch is free on a first-come first-served basis.

RESIDENTIAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents ONLY, and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to noon at the Small Load Drop-Off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406.

COMMERCIAL RECYCLING IS REQUIRED BY LAW

Pennsylvania State Act 101 of 1988 and York Township Ordinance 2006-12 require nonresidential establishments to recycle. To comply with the State and Local laws, you are required to recycle the following:

Used oil (motor, cooking, transmission) can be dropped off at the Public Works Service Building Monday – Friday from 7:00 am – 3:30 pm. We do not accept gasoline or engine coolant (anti-freeze).

WHY SHOULD I BUY AN AMBULANCE SUBSCRIPTION?

Peace of Mind in an Emergency:

Although many patients have medical insurance coverage of some type, most insurance plans cover only a portion of the fees associated with transportation to the hospital or will pay for only those fees they consider to be “usual and customary.” Unfortunately, this amount is usually far below our cost to provide 24-hour a day emergency ambulance service to a population of 40,000+ citizens. Any portion of the fees not covered by private insurance, becomes an out-of-pocket expense for the patient.

As a **First Capital EMS Subscriber**, payment from your insurance carrier(s) will satisfy your obligation to us for our service costs*. Non-Subscribers are responsible for payment in full for services, regardless of the amount covered by their insurance carrier. Subscribers shall forward any payments received directly from their insurance carrier to First Capital EMS immediately upon receipt.

The demand for emergency medical services has grown dramatically over the past several years. If we are already committed to an emergency when you need us, the 911 Center will dispatch the next closest available ambulance service. This subscription is also honored by 5 neighboring EMS agencies shown below:

- Red Lion Ambulance
- Southern York County EMS
- Eureka Fire and Ambulance
- Rose Fire Company (New Freedom)

All patients will be responsible for a charge of \$95 – \$300 for refusal of transport when evaluation and/or treatment is provided. Non-transport is not covered by the subscription

HOP ABOARD RABBITTRANSIT SHARED RIDER



Do you have difficulties driving or arranging transportation for yourself to and from running errands, medical appointments, recreational activities, or simply visiting friends? There's an easy way to get where you need to go: Book a Shared Ride with rabbittransit.

Unlike a scheduled bus route that only operates in one area, Shared Ride (a.k.a. Paratransit) is a door-to-door service which provides consolidated trips between travel origins and destinations; operates during limited hours and specific areas; and requires an application and reservation to ride.

Riders are grouped together depending upon their travel time and location(s), which means Shared Ride isn't non-stop. Travel times may be shorter or longer, depending on the total number of riders at the time, which makes it essential to plan accordingly. While ride times may vary, Shared Ride is a reliable and safe transportation option that can give you peace of mind when accessing life sustaining services.

If Shared Ride sounds like a fit for you, the first step is to apply to the program you wish to participate in. Shared Ride programs vary from Senior Shared Ride to the Medical Assistance Transportation Program (MATP), ADA Complementary Paratransit Program (ADA), or Paratransit Full Fare. Riders in select programs may be eligible for free fare. Apply for Shared Ride by visiting www.rabbittransit.org > Shared Ride > How to apply.

The next step is to book a reservation. All Paratransit trips require a reservation, made no later than 12:00 pm the business day before your ride. Reservations may be made as far ahead as two weeks. PARTICIPATION AND REGISTRATION GUIDELINES

- **REGISTRATION FORMS for various programs** will be placed online at www.yorktownshiprec.com as they become available. Forms for some programs may also be picked up at the YTRec Office.
- **ADVANCE PAYMENT** is required for all programs as it will ensure a space in the class/program. Checks may be made payable to York Township.
- **PARTICIPATION** in any class/program/event constitutes permission to use likeness in promotional materials.
- **THE DEPARTMENT** is **NOT** responsible for injuries while participating in any of its activities.
- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician will be required. No refunds for Bus Trips will be given when spots are cancelled less than 30 days before trip unless the trip is cancelled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- **PROGRAM SIZE** is limited and will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.
- **PROGRAM DATES & TIMES** are contingent on availability of facilities and are subject to change.
- **PROGRAMS** postponed or not held by the instructor due to emergencies will be made up by the instructor or fees will be prorated. Classes missed by the participant will not be made up.
- **POLICY ON CHILDREN**—Participants are not permitted to bring children with them to class. Enrollment age is included with the description of most of the classes.

PARK RULES/HOURS

- All Township Parks, with the exception of York Township Park, are closed from dusk to dawn. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
- No littering.
- No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
- **NO GOLFING IN PARKS.** Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
- Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned. Grills may not be placed on picnic tables.
- No solicitation.
- **No alcoholic beverages or drugs.** No one shall use or be under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs in any parks.
- **Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, rifles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.**
- Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
- Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
- No facilities may be reserved or events scheduled without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
- Parks may be closed if hazardous conditions endanger life or property. In said event, there should be no trespassing on park property in said times.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
- Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
- **No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game trucks etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.**
